

Limited income lunch fee reduced

Elementary students whose families qualify for reduced-price lunches will get a further break starting next week.

Clark Lund, superintendent of the Sandy Elementary School District, reported that a new federal regulation concerning reduced priced lunches goes into effect Monday, Jan. 29. The new regulation will make lunches available to

qualifying students at 10 cents per meal rather than 20 cents per meal as it has been up to this time.

Only students from families who can demonstrate a limited income are affected by the change. Lund emphasized that parents may apply for reduced price lunches at any time during the school year. They should apply to the principals of any buildings their children attend in the district.

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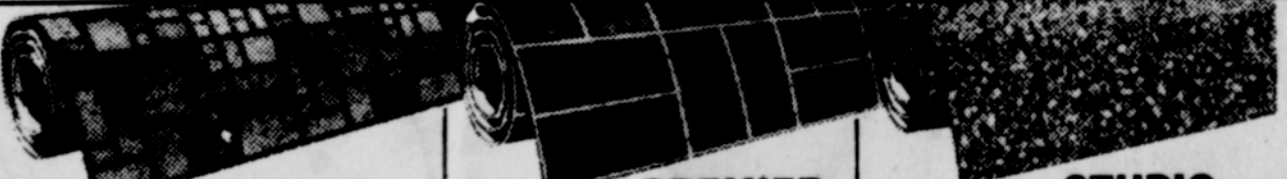
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
