SANDY 4-H member Nancy Olson was reunited with Webb, a German shepherd she raised and trained, during graduation ceremonies at the headquarters of Guide Dogs for the Blind, Inc. in San Rafael, Calif. Webb was presented to Larry Pickett of Oklahoma City, Okla., at May 26 graduation which marked the successful conclusion of a month's training course for the class of blind persons. Webb was born and raised to the age of three months in the kennels of Guide Dogs for the Blind, and was then given to Olson, who taught him simple obedience and good manners. Under the Guide Dogs program, 4-H members return the dogs to the school when they are approximately 18 months old so the dogs can complete a five to six month program of Guide Dog training with a licensed instructor. There is no charge to the blind for the dogs or in-resident training and the organization is supported entirely by private contributions.

Perkins earns degree from Marylhurst

Zig Zag resident Patsy Ann Perkins received a bachelor of arts degree in interdisciplinary studies from Marylhurst Education Center on June 10.

Perkins, who moved to the Mt. Hood area from Minnesota a few years ago, specialized in communications. Perkins said she was attracted to the Mt. Hood area after visiting it and meeting area residents, and decided to settle in the area to avail herself of the hiking and camping opportunities.

She was also attracted to Marylhurst's Education Center's non-traditional program which gave her the option to earn credit for her experiences as well as to participate in traditional study.

Much of her efforts went into developing and coordination of the "Marylhurst-Goes-to-Sea" course which takes place on a 101-foot restored turn-of-the-century schooner.

"Exploring marine life and ecology while sailing the Puget Sound makes me feel like an adventurer," Perkins said. Adventurous, too, is the fact that Perkins accumulated 100 credit hours toward her degree this last academic year.

Although Perkins will devote the summer months to relaxation and continuing her teaching of handicrafts, swimming and academics at Christie School, her future pursuits include graduate studies in counseling—or possibly in intercultural communication.

"And who knows," she

adds, "I might even consider looking at an alternative career, such as long-haul truck driving!"

Perkins graduated with 62 other students, ranging in age from 21 to 60. Thirty-seven of the graduates had gone through the Prior Learning Experience program, which awards college credit for live-work learning experiences.

The students made an extensive portfolio documenting their experiences which was evaluated by a team of academicians and professionals in the students chosen field.

To date, 127 students have graduated from Marylhurst Education Center, a college which provides programs for the adult learner.
