Marlins take 5th at "A" Invitational

The Blue Marlin Aquatic Club placed fifth in the age group "A" Invitational swim meet at Mountain Park last weekend. The meet was won by host Mountain Park (point totals were not available at press time).

Only two Blue Marlins placed in the top six of the finals but the Sandy swimmers used their depth to pick up their fifth place finish.

The best performance came from nine-year-old Troy Hilstad, who is continuing to take on the 10-year-olds with success. The young Marlin won the boys 10-and-under 100 butterfly with a time of 1:26.04.

Matt Roth took sixth in the 400 individual medley for boys 14-and-under. His time was 6:00.33.

Other Marlins who swam at Mountain Park were Michelle Fleischman, Ruth Carlile, Matt Woodfield, Terri Hansen, Nicole Iseli, Jamie Tuttle, Richard Rolph, Doug Crane and Steve Grable.

Chris Roth leads Marlin seniors

An old name from a familiar family resurfaced last weekend and the beneficiary was the Blue Marlin Aquatic Club.

Chris Roth returned from the waters of the Brigham Young University swimming pool to compete for the Marlins for the first time in several years. And it didn't take long for the 20-year-old to show that he still has the touch as Roth placed in seven events leading the Marlins to an 11th place finish at the Mt. Hood Senior "AA" Championships.

But Chris Roth was the big winner. He placed third in the 200-meter butterfly in 2:12.5; fourth in the 100-fly in 1:00.0; fifth in the 200-individual medley in 2:19.3; sixth in the 400-individual medley in 4:54.9; sixth in the 200-backstroke in 2:52.2; eighth in the 1,500 freestyle in 17:30.9 and 11th in the 400-freestyle in 4:26.1.

Gayle Roth was the only other Marlin to place, finishing 16th in the 100-backstroke in 1:20.8.

"There was a lot of real stiff competition," Hilde said. "It was probably the biggest meet of the year in the Northwest except for the regionals."

"That Roth family is something else."

The meet was won by the Highline Swim Club of Highline, Wash. Second place went to the Tacoma Swim Club and third went to the Multnomah Athletic Club. Point totals were not available at press time.

Mark Mayfield and Matt Falgout were the other two Marlins who qualified for the meet. Neither placed in their events.

Roth was the reason the Marlins were 11th, according to coach Gary Hilde. "We only took four swimmers to the meet and we got 11th out of 22 teams," he said. "The senior "AA" qualifying standards are so high that it's mostly returning college students that make it."

Except for Roth's younger sister, Gayle, she has ever placed in a senior meet. And she is only a freshman at Sandy High School.

Pro golf opens at Glendoveer

Immunization problem faces school officials

School and public health nurses face a problem at this time of year when children who register for school are required to be in compliance with Oregon's School Immunization Law for tetanus, diphtheria and polio.

The problem arises when a child's unfinished immunization history bears little resemblance to the recommended schedule.

The U.S. Public Health Service's Advisory Committee for Immunization Practices and the American Academy of Pediatrics specifically define the timing of doses for the primary immunization of infants and children. The recommendations outline how a child should be scheduled to receive optimal benefit from the vaccine.

The rules of the Oregon Health Division say that children should have five DTP and four polio vaccinations by the time they are of school age. If the child has not been on a regular immunization schedule, it may not be necessary to have exactly this number of doses for adequate protection from these diseases, according to the Oregon Health Division.

The reason for the recommendations is to provide a reasonable guide which will promote immunity without excessive use of vaccine. There is no single best way to conduct catch-up immunizations.

The basic principle to follow in administering vaccine to partially immunized children is to complete the series as outlined by the state. Of primary importance.

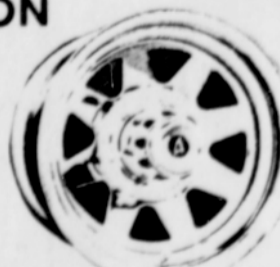

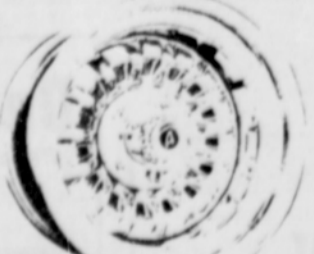
