

Pickup theft suspect caught in California

A Boring man reported to Sandy police that his pickup truck was stolen early last Wednesday, Nov. 21. A suspect was captured four days later in Orange County, Calif.

Leonard Waugh reported that his 1969 Chevrolet pickup was taken at approximately 6:20 a.m. The vehicle was recovered the same day in Hood River. A 14-year-old juvenile was arrested on other charges in California Nov. 25, and admitted taking the truck.

Sandy police arrested Robert L. Carey, 19, Tuesday, Nov. 20, and charged him with being away without leave from the military. He was held for military authorities.

Randy Bollmer reported the theft of a purse and its contents from his vehicle parked in the Williams Thriftway parking lot Thursday, Nov. 22. The purse was later found and miscellaneous items were missing.

McCarthy.

McCarthy said DeCarlo has a history of armed robbery and escape convictions.
