Film showings announced

Christmas vacation will find the introduction of a new feature for restless youngsters and adults. The Sandy Community Center is inaugurating a film series and, if it is successful, it will continue past the vacation time.

Friday, Dec. 21, the films begin with "Wait Until Dark" starring Audrey Hepburn, Alan Arkin and Richard Crenna. This 1968 film is the chilling tale of how three clever, diabolical thugs get themselves into the apartment of a recently-blinded woman.

They are in search of smuggled items innocently brought home in a doll by her unsuspecting husband.

The following Friday, Dec. 28, a 1971 film, "Bless the Beasts and Children," will be shown at the center. The film, starring Bill Mumy and Barry Robins, is the story of six teenagers who have become misfits in an Arizona boys' camp due to their incompetence at sports. They

decide to free a captive heard of buffalo being slaughtered by hunters. The film captures the tragedy of abusing natural resources as well as being a portrayal of irrepressible youth.

Both movies will begin at 7 p.m. at the Sandy Community Center. Movie-goers are asked to use the west entrance to the center. Admission is \$1.

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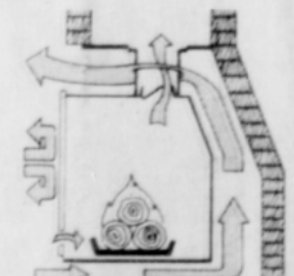
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
