'Astronomy and Bible' talk set

An "Astronomy and the Bible" seminar will be conducted by Luther Clendenon of Aloha this Friday and Saturday at the Sandy Seventh-day Adventist Church, at the intersection of Highway 26 and University Avenue.

Clendenon, an engineering technician for the Bonneville Power Administration, has studied astronomy since he was a teen-ager. For the past 16 years he has lectured on the subject, including a trip to England for one series.

Recent scientific discoveries confirm statements in the Bible concerning heavenly bodies,

Clendenon points out. "The Bible is a very scientific book," he says. "Centuries ago the Book of Job recorded that Arcturus is a fast or running star, and it took us until the 20th century to discover this."

Clendenon uses the Psalms to show how "modern" the Psalmist is in his knowledge of the planets and the solar system. "In Psalm 19 David hints at the fact that the sun travels in a circuit which appears to be a straight line," he said.

"It has only been in the last century that scientists have discovered that the sun travels in an orbit so ex-

tensive that it is believed to be a straight line." He will also discuss the differences between the science of astronomy and astrology.

Most of the slides Clendenon will use in his lectures were obtained through the help of the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry, and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

Registration will begin at 7 p.m. Friday, Feb. 22. The topic that evening, at 7:30 p.m., is "God's Invitation to Study Astronomy" with slides on "Our Solar System."

Saturday's programs include "Signs in the

Heavens" at 11 a.m.; "What the Astrologers Don't Tell You" at 2 p.m.; "How to Build Character" at 4 p.m.; "The Science of Astronomy" at 7 p.m., and "God's Colossal Universe" with slides on "Outer Space" at 8 p.m.

There will be periods for questions and discussions at 3:30 and 5 p.m. A potluck dinner will be served at 1 p.m. and a salad supper at 6 p.m. in the Community Center building.

There is no charge for the seminar, however, there will be a charge for the syllabus used in the seminar.

Dedication service slated

A new Chapel of the Hills, built on the site of the landmark log church that burned in 1975, will hold a dedication service this Sunday at 11 a.m.

The new chapel was designed by former pastor

Thyra Strand and retired minister and part-time contractor Palmer Hanson. It was built by volunteer help over a four-year period. It is located 12 miles east of Sandy on Highway 26.

Pastor Kent McKinnon will

be in charge of the ceremony. He will be joined by former ministers Jeffrey Brockway and Loren Horton in the dedication.

Wallard Aldrich, past president of Multnomah School of the Bible, and the Rev. John Groenlund of the school will attend. Rev. Palmer Hanson will also be present.

Fellowship and refreshments will follow the service.
