McAllister said. "With passage of the levy, we'd be able to have people working on those and we'll be able to cover our districts. As it is now, our response time is awful. I'll be the first to admit it."

From the other side of the criminal justice department, District Attorney Jim O'Leary told commissioners that the recessionary economy and overcrowded conditions at the county jail are working together to produce a higher crime rate, bringing greater demands upon his office.

Because of overcrowding, convicted criminals with lesser offenses are being released from the jail "sometimes within 60 to 90 days," said O'Leary, and many end up back at the jail for repeat offenses.

Misdemeanor cases prosecuted by his office increased 23 percent during 1980, down from an increase of 46 percent in 1979, he said. Felony cases, however, increased by 28 percent in

1980, up from a 5.5 percent increase in 1979. The county jail has a higher percentage of felons than at any time in its past, he said. "We're seeing a tougher type of criminal."

O'Leary said his office may have to begin "prioritizing" the growing number of cases it receives, which could mean that major fraud cases (which take lots of time for the least benefit) and victimless crime cases could end up not being prosecuted.

"People are going to have to get used to the county providing less services," said Commissioner Ralph Groener, who found the "state of the county" session enlightening. "If they want the same level of services, it's going to require their (tax dollar) support," he said.

"I still think we're high in terms of livability," said Commissioner Bob Schumacher. "I think we're just victims of a trend, like everywhere else."
