## Bible study for women set at church

"Strike the Original Match," a study on rekindling the marriage fires, "Enriching Your Devotional Life" and "Courage and Submission," a study of the Books of Esther and Ruth are the three elective courses which will be offered at Sandy Baptist Church on Thursdays from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m.

The Bible Study for Women will be held each Thursday for 13 weeks and begins this week, Jan. 29, with a sign-up at the church. At that time it will be explained in more detail what classes will be offered.

Women will be able to sign up for the elective course they intend to take, but if someone is unable to attend this session, the regular study will begin next Thursday, Feb. 5, and sign-up will also be available that day.

"The format for the Bible Study will be a 45-minute get-together where we will look at some of the principles of the Christian life and how we as women can better live these principles in our own homes, community and church," said Lorraine

Grable, coordinator for Women's Bible Study.

"Then we will break up into the three discussion study groups and will study the particular subject we feel to be our greatest need. We feel that this will meet the need of fellowshiping and studying together the main principles of growth and Christian living and still provide a time for a small group interaction on topics and areas of need," she added.

Babysitting will be available for pre-schoolers in the church nursery during the study time. There will also be a pre-school Bible hour provided for four and five-year-olds.

"Strike the Original Match" will be a group study on marriage and how God intended marriage to be and how to keep your marriage alive and exciting.

The group will use "Strike

the Original Match," by Charles Swindall, as a text. The group is not limited to people having trouble with their marriages, Grable said, but for anyone who would like to look into what God has to say about marriage and how it is intended to function as a fundamental institution in society.

"Enriching Your Devotional Life" is to be a

group for those who desire to establish and maintain a daily devotional time in their life. This group will share practical ways to make the Bible meaningful in your life, ways of studying it and praying, and various helps and aids to enrich this time together.

The group will study various books, booklets and the Bible as the key to devotional life.

"Courage and Submission" is a study of the lives of Esther and Ruth through those two books of the Bible. It will be an in-depth study of the two books and how God used these women in various ways.

All 14 weeks will be held at Sandy Baptist Church, 34495 S.E. Jarl Road, two miles west of Sandy off Highway 26.

The chili feed will include hot dogs, celery and carrot sticks, ice cream, milk, coffee and tea. Seconds will be available on chili and crackers.

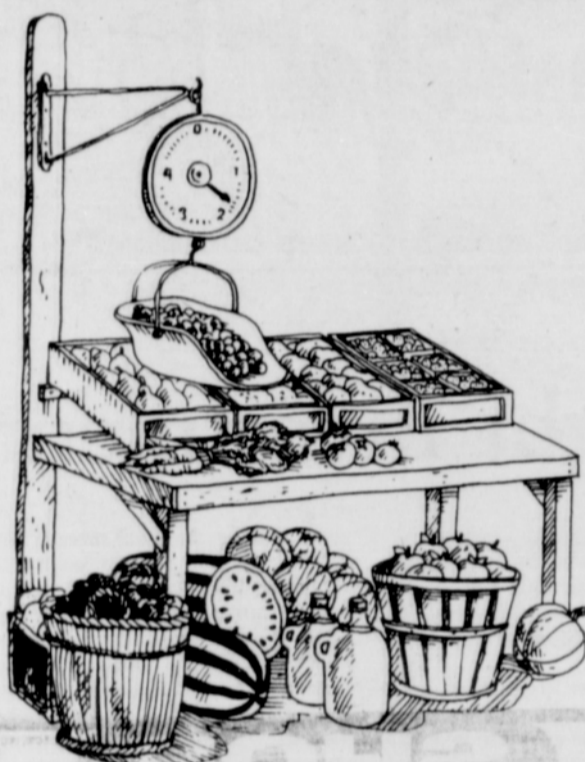
On the main floor, a carnival will be held featuring a cake walk, fish pond, basketball toss and door prizes donated by local merchants.

## Rep. Smith announces committee appointment

Rep. Denny Smith, R-Oregon, received his top committee choice last Wednesday when it was announced that he would serve on the House Interior and Insular Affairs Committee.

"More than 70 percent of the land in the 2nd District is controlled by the government," Smith said, "much of it by the federal government."

"The Interior and Insular Affairs Committee has jurisdiction over forest reserves, irrigation and reclamation projects, Indian lands, mineral resources and experiment station, all of which are extremely important to the mainstay of our economy in Oregon," he continued.

Smith's military service earned him a slot on the Veterans Affairs Committee. Smith said his membership on the Veterans Committee should help as the Oregon delegation works toward a solution of the state's veteran home loan problem. Thousands of Oregon

veterans learned recently that their veteran loan commitments had been withdrawn because of legislation passed in the closing days of the last session of Congress.

Smith has joined Oregon's senators and his Oregon colleagues in the House to develop legislation.

"Veterans' rights must be protected," Smith said.

Smith's subcommittee assignments have not been made.
