

Pioneer swimmers sweep Oregon City

The Sandy High swimming team crushed visiting Oregon City, Friday, in both schools' final warmup before the district meet.

The Pioneer girls won 88-53 and the boys claimed a 52-34 win over Oregon City.

Junior Gayle Roth keyed the Sandy girls' effort with a pair of individual wins. Roth turned in the fourth fastest time in the state this year in the 50-yard freestyle, winning in 25.19. She has finished fourth in the state meet the past two years in that event.

Roth also won the 100-freestyle with ease, clocking a 56.37, her best time of the season.

Bonita Connelly took the 200-freestyle for Sandy with a time of 2:13.84. Connelly is also a junior.

Another junior, Jean Crane, won the 200-individual medley for the Pioneers. She was timed in 2:36.55.

The fourth member of Sandy's "Junior Connection," Teresa Lamer, picked up the Pioneers' final individual win. She took the 500-freestyle with a time of 6:03.3.

The four juniors combined to win the 400-freestyle relay

with a time of 4:07.90.

Picking up important second places for the Pioneers were Connelly, Crane, Nic DuBois and Heidi Lamer.

Sandy won the low-scoring boys meet with relative ease. Both teams are short-handed which led to the low score. Three events were not run at all.

The ones that were run were dominated by Sandy. The team of Bret Crane, Matt Falgout, Harry Hazelett and Rick Topliff combined to win the 200-medley relay in 1:53.13.

Topliff won the 50-freestyle in 24.12, then came back to win the 100-butterfly in 1:00.85.

Falgout was second in both of those events.

Crane won the 100-backstroke in 1:05.16 and took third in the butterfly.

Shawn Burns took the 200-freestyle in 2:01.62, then came back to take third in the 100-free.

Hazelett was second in the 100-breaststroke.

The Pioneers will compete in the Wilco League District meet this Friday and Saturday, Feb. 13-14, at the Mt. Hood Community College pool. The first preliminary events will begin at 9 a.m.

The Swimmers won the undisputed "B" Division title by dumping second place Dairy Queen Wednesday night. The Swimmers will also represent Sandy in regional play Feb. 21, when they play at Estacada. Their first game is scheduled for 9 a.m. Both the "A" and "B" tournaments will involve 16 teams.
