Qualify for state

Sandy 2nd in TVL chess

The Sandy High chess club placed second last week in the Timber Valley League district match.

Oregon City won with a 2-0-1 record, followed by Sandy, 2-1; Estacada, 1-2; and Silverton, 0-2-1.

With the second place finish, the Pioneers qualified for the state tournament, scheduled for Feb. 27-28 in Grants Pass.

The Pioneers were led by Tim Zimmerman, who moved up to second board and captured a first-place trophy at that position with a spotless 3-0 record.

"That was a real surprise," admitted Sandy chess club advisor Roger Ford. "Tim had just a tremendous last round

game. He just crushed the Oregon City man. I know that sounds funny in chess, but he really did crush him.

He won in less than 15 moves and he was going against an undefeated opponent.

Bryon Gehring of Silverton won first board with a 3-0 record. Third board went to John Schrock of Oregon City with a 2-0-1 mark; fourth board went to Matt Perrott of Silverton, 2-1; and fifth board honors were captured by Curt Landers of Estacada with a 3-0 mark.

The Pioneers went into the Oregon City match with three unbeaten players and a chance to capture the TVL title. In a match earlier this season, Sandy edged the visitors 22-19 and lost the

first two boards.

But things did a complete turnaround at district. Sandy won the first two boards, but lost the last three. Oregon City snuck away with a 22-19 win and the district title.

However, Stuart Bilyeu made a little history by capturing the only first board win in the history of the club. He finished the day with a 1-2 record.

Chris Botcheos was 2-1 for Sandy in the third board seat. Roman Scott, a fourth board, was 0-2. Pete Watkins alternated between fourth and fifth board and wound up with a 2-1 mark. Scot Benson, a fifth board substitute, was 0-1 in his only match.

Dog license deadline nears

The deadline for licensing your dog is approaching.

All dogs six months of age and older must be licensed. The 1981 schedule is \$12 for fertile males and females, and \$6 for neutered or altered males and females. Senior citizens receive a \$3 discount on each license-

type.

After the March 1 deadline there will be a \$15 penalty added to the cost of each dog license. Senior citizens, 65 years and older who can show proof of age, will be given a half price discount on one dog per household.

When applying for a dog license, applicants must submit a valid rabies certificate which is good through Oct. 31, 1981. Proof of sterilization is also required for the discount on all spayed and neutered dogs.

There will be no licenses sold locally this year.
