YCC applications ready

Applications will be accepted now through March 15 for nearly 1,000 jobs with the Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) in Oregon this summer.

The youth work program is operated by Oregon State Parks, several bureaus of the Department of the Interior and the U.S. Forest Service. The YCC provides jobs during the summer for persons at least 15 and not yet 19 years old.

The YCC is open to all youth, but applicants should have an interest in the natural environment. Selections for jobs will be by statewide random drawings by computer.

Former YCC participants are not eligible for a second year, but may apply for youth leader positions. Former participants interested in a youth leader position should apply to their former camps.

Participants in the YCC are introduced to environmental issues, contribute to their solutions and work with the management and development of public lands.

In past years, YCC has completed projects involving stream improvement, tree thinning, range fencing, trail construction, fish and wildlife habitat improvement, and construction of recreation facilities.

Young men and women work side by side beginning on or about the last week of June for periods ranging from four to eight weeks. Enrollee pay is based on the federal minimum wage, with deductions made for board and room at residential camps.

Persons interested in the program may obtain more information and applications at high schools, state employment offices, youth and social organizations and Forest Service and Interior Bureau offices.


At the meeting, Christensen outlined the details of the trip, including the projected cost of \$6,160.
