

## Program nets added bonus

When the Oregon Employment Division started checking with employers last October to see if people who draw unemployment are actually looking for work, the idea was to nudge claimants out of the benefits line back into jobs.

However, the program has netted Oregon employers an additional bonus in the form of fraud restitution and penalties.

During the final quarter of 1980, 68 unemployment claimants were ordered to repay \$40,560 to the Employment Division because their stories didn't check out with employers where they said they had applied for work.

The money is returned to the unemployment in-

urance trust fund where it helps hold down taxes for Oregon employers. Each claimant also forfeited future benefits for periods ranging from one to 26 weeks, netting further savings to the fund.

"I think people are beginning to get the idea that we are serious about fraud in the unemployment insurance program in Oregon," said Ray Thorne, administrator of the Division. "If we find out claimants have been cheating, odds are we'll get them either in the courts or with administrative penalties."

In addition to the \$40,560 reclaimed through the work-search verification pro-

gram, the Employment Division ordered \$158,642 in repayments and denied 3,802 weeks of benefits in fraud cases detected by other methods during the last three months of 1980.

Although administrative penalties and denied benefits are costly and embarrassing to claimants who try to cheat the system, their misery doesn't necessarily end there, Thorne said.

"We turn the most flagrant cases over to local district attorneys for criminal prosecution. This is usually treated as a felony and often results in periods of probation, fines and an occasional jail sentence in addition to restitution payments," Thorne said.

## Post office watch begins

For area senior citizens concerned about their safety or who need someone to check on them if they are ill, hurt or in need of help, a new program can help.

The Sandy post office will deliver an emergency service form called Post Office Watch to seniors in the area within the next few weeks.

A registration form is part of the brochure. Briefly, if a senior does not pick up his mail, the mail carrier notifies the Clackamas County Senior Council who then immediately checks on the senior. It may mean that something is very wrong.

"Many people are concerned about older people living alone," said Dorothy

Flink, coordinator of the program.

Chuck Tropp, acting postmaster in Sandy, and his staff of carriers are implementing the program, in conjunction with the Senior Council.
