Living in the spotlight may have its rewards for many individuals, but it takes it toll, too. What happens when both partners are sharing the same limelight?

Beverly Sills once said she thought a strong factor in her happy marriage to business executive Peter Greenough was that they worked in different fields. The last thing he wanted to be was her manager; he left the opera and concert world to her. Indeed, he was mighty brief about it when his bubbly, red-headed spouse, on stage at Carnegie Hall, asked, "Though it's not his custom, will my handsome husband take a bow?" The occasion was the taping of the PBS 1981 Gala of Stars which she emceed. (Produced by New York's WNET 13 as a smashing finale to fund-raising week by PBS stations, it airs March 22).

Ann-Margret's case is the opposite. She's said that if husband Roger Smith had not taken over the management of her career in its earlier stages, she wouldn't have found the measures of security and happiness that led to her success. He gave up his own promising acting career but says it was no sacrifice, because he didn't enjoy it that much.
