Kids of all ages are invited to attend the bike-a-thon and prizes will be awarded, with a 10-speed bicycle going to the top rider.

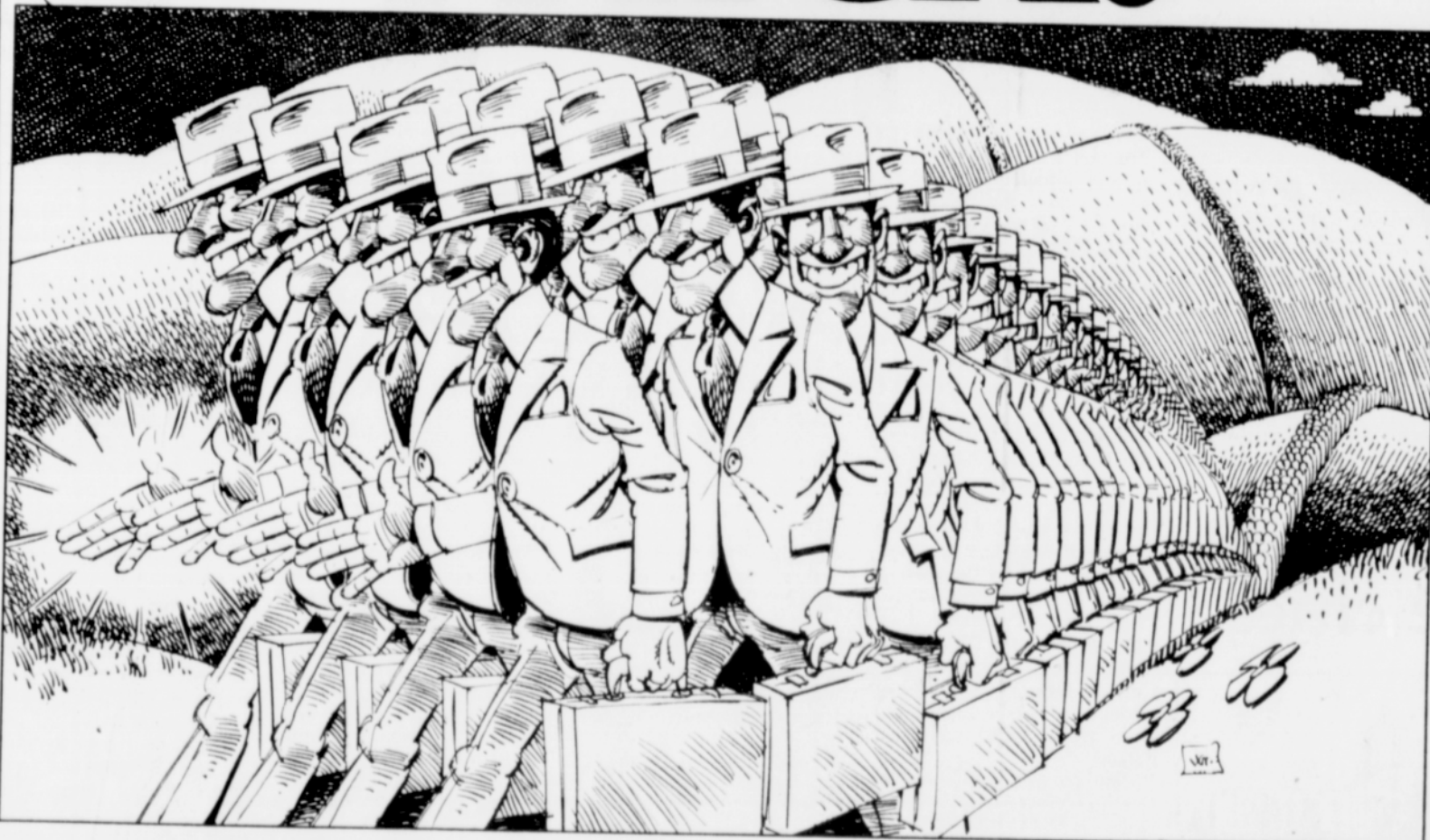
"The local TV stations have been notified and we hope at least one news crew will be on hand to cover the event," Tinjum said.

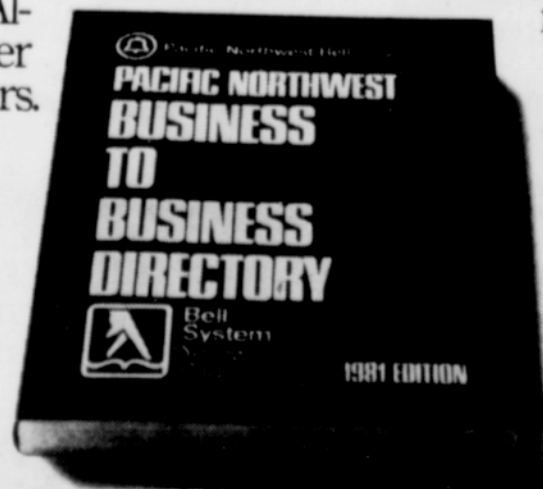
