The casting of a perfect Scarlett

Every actress in Hollywood
wanted the role of Scarlett
O'Hara.

Or so it seemed, when it
was announced that Margaret
Mitchell's best-selling, Pul-
itzer Prize-winning novel
'Gone with the Wind' was
going to be made into a
movie.

In England meanwhile, a
young actress not yet well
known in the United States —
Vivien Leigh — had her heart
set on the same project,
although everyone told her
she hadn't a ghost of a chance.

Miss Leigh got her way, of
course, and the epic classic
movie that resulted will be
rebroadcast as a two-part
special, Sunday, March 22 and
Tuesday, March 24 on CBS.

Choosing Rhett Butler was
easy. Through a newspaper
survey, the novel's readers
overwhelmingly picked the
popular Clark Gable as the
ideal Rhett, and producer
David O. Selznick agreed that
Gable was right for the role.
According to some reports,
though, his first choice had
actually been Gary Cooper,
and he had also considered
Ronald Colman, Basil Rath-
bone and Errol Flynn.

But casting Scarlett O'Hara

was another matter. That
same poll had come up with
two favorites — Bette Davis,
who had just portrayed a
Southern belle in 'Jezebel,'
and Margaret Sullivan, the
heroine of another movie
about the Old South, 'So Red
the Rose.' Selznick did not
feel either was right for the
strong-willed coquette of the
novel. So he launched a
nationwide search for Scar-
lett, including highly pub-
licized visits to Atlanta and
New Orleans to interview
hundreds of professional and
amateur hopefuls. Meanwhile,
the real search back in Holly-

wood was just as grueling.

Paulette Goddard is report-
ed to have been the leading
contender there, but there
was some worry that she
would attract bad press
because of her relationship
with Charlie Chaplin. Jean
Arthur and Joan Bennett were
in the running right down to
the wire; they had won out
against earlier contenders,
including Lucille Ball, Norma
Shearer, Lana Turner, Miriam
Hopkins, Loretta Young, Joan
Crawford, Katharine Hepburn
and Tallulah Bankhead.

Selznick also considered new-
comers Margaret Tallichet,
New York model Susan
Hayward, and Atlanta debu-
tante Catherine Campbell
(who later became Mrs. Ran-
dolph Hearst).

Three other newcomers
under consideration eventual-
ly won other roles in the
movie: Starlet Evelyn Keyes
played Scarlett's complaining
sister Suellen, Alicia Rhett
was cast as India Wilkes, and
Mary Anderson played May-
belle Meriwether.

to have won her role indirect-

The role of Ashley Wilkes

Lynn, Ray Milland and Shep-
perd Strudwick.

In the end, Selznick began
his grand production without
a Scarlett. Vivien Leigh had
been mentioned to him as a
possibility, but Selznick had
dismissed the idea. Her Eng-
lish films had not played
much in the United States out-
side of a few big cities, and
the Selznick thought the Ameri-
can public would reject a
British actress in such a pure-
ly American role.

But Miss Leigh was deter-
mined, as well as perfect for
the role. She arranged to meet
Selznick on the set while they
were filming the burning of Atlanta
