

Sandy High offers MHCC night extension classes this spring

Sandy Union High School is one of eight schools in the Mount Hood Community College education district that will offer MHCC courses in the evenings during spring term beginning Monday, March 30.

Most of the courses are college-credit classes ranging from accounting and karate to pottery and wood-working while the rest are special non-credit classes, according to Margaret Gratton, MHCC associate dean of community education.

"Each school has a coordinator to help plan, schedule and publicize the college classes at their schools," Gratton said.

According to Sandy coordinator Carolyn Yandell, SUHS will offer classes in six different areas: arts and crafts; basic skills; business education; health and physical education; landscaping, and photography.

Pottery classes will be held Tuesdays from 7 to 10 p.m. at the high school art room. Woodworking class will meet each Monday from 7 to 10 p.m. the high school shop.

ABEGED classes will meet Monday and Wednesday from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m. at Cedar Ridge School. The classes are designed to meet the requirements for the purpose of receiving a high

school equivalency certificate, to upgrade basic skills or for self-improvement.

Three levels of bookkeeping—accounting classes will be offered each Wednesday from 7 to 10 p.m. at room 65 at the high school.

All the preceding classes carry two hours of college credit. The physical education classes will carry one college-credit hour. They are three levels of karate, meeting each Tuesday from 7-10 p.m. at the Sandy Grade School gym.

Modern jazz exercise will meet each Wednesday from 7 to 10 p.m. at the high school gym 'C'. No credits are

available for this class.

Landscaping class will meet at the high school room 4 each Thursday from 7 to 10 p.m. It is a non-credit class.

Photography class will meet at Camera Connection, 39570 Pioneer Blvd., each Thursday from 7 to 10 p.m. with two credit-hours. Students need own 35 mm or medium format camera with adjustable shutter speed, aperture control, hand-held or built-in light meter, and are responsible for own film and materials.

Many drop-outs opt for GED

A recent survey of students who quit Oregon high schools before graduation shows that nearly 83 percent of the early-leavers intend to pursue their education.

One way for former students to accomplish their return to education begins next Monday, March 30, at 6:30 p.m. at Cedar Ridge School in room 13.

The spring term of classes to prepare students for the General Education Development (GED) will meet each

Monday and Wednesday evening. The class, however, features open enrollment for persons unable to attend the opening session. That means students will be able to join the class at any time, according to its teacher, Eileen Houser.

The classes prepare students for the GED test or help those still in school brush up on their skills in five areas: reading, writing, mathematics, science and social studies.

Sandy had 26 enrollees for the winter term, according to Houser, and five successfully completed their tests. All those who successfully complete the tests are eligible to take part in the GED graduation ceremony June 4 on the Mount Hood Community College campus.

The free class offers some side benefits for enrollees. A student body card for MHCC, which sponsors the class, is available to each student. It entitles the

bearer to free swimming, a library card and discounts on haircuts, Houser said.

Those who enroll are also eligible for a \$5 discount when they take the GED exam.

A principal use lot size variance application for property near Dunn Road will be considered Monday, March 30, by the Clackamas County hearings officer at 7 p.m. in the County Courthouse.

The area is zoned EFU-20, exclusive farm use with a 20-acre minimum lot size.

The application is available for inspection at the Department of Environmental Services, Planning Division, 902 Abernethy Road, Oregon City. Interested citizens are invited to attend the hearing and testify. The hearings officer will also consider all written correspondence.
