Mark Twain's modern vision of Civil War

"You have the two greatest gifts of a writer, memory and imagination," wrote John Hay, soon to be America's Secretary of State, to Mark Twain. The occasion was the publication in Atlantic magazine of the first installment of "Life on the Mississippi."

"The Private History of a Campaign that Failed," to air Monday, April 6 on PBS (check local listings for air times in your area) covers the period of Twain's life immediately following the segment covered in "Life on the Mississippi."

"Life on the Mississippi" is based on young Samuel Clemens' (Twain's real name) experiences as a riverboat pilot from 1857 to 1861. He resigned as a pilot when growing hostilities in the Civil War made river navigation too dangerous. Like 50,000 other young Missourians, he joined one of the loosely-organized militias then forming all over the state to drive the Yankees off Missouri soil.

Twain wrote "Life on the Mississippi" in 1883. Two years later, in 1885, he wrote "The Private History of a Campaign that Failed," which

was first published in Century magazine. It dramatizes his short period of service as the second-in-command of a rag-tag group of teen-agers who called themselves the Marion County Rangers and whose battle experience as a group was limited, at least in the story, to the accidental ambush of a solitary civilian.

This first taste of war was enough for Twain; he resigned

his "commission" and headed West on the extended trip that was to turn him into a real writer.

It was not until almost 45 years later, in 1904 or 1905, that Twain wrote the intense short essay called "The War Prayer," which is dramatized in the the PBS special as an epilogue to "The Private History of a Campaign that Failed." "The War Prayer" is

an anti-war piece of such great power that its author forbade its publication during his lifetime.

Twain was a different man when he wrote "The War Prayer": older, more cynical, deeply convinced that human behavior is motivated by selfishness. "The War Prayer," in addition to being a rousing sermon against war and bloodshed, is an indictment of the shortsightedness that prevents people from understanding that victory for their side is achieved at the expense of misery for the other.

Twain, however, did believe, in war when it was the only course of action that would right a vast wrong. Throughout his life, he believed it was the duty of the individual to evaluate the cause in which he was being asked to fight — and to act accordingly.

In 1884, one year before he produced "The Private History of a Campaign that Failed," he wrote to William Dean Howells expressing his sentiments: "... Man's first duty is to his own conscience and honor — the party and the country come second to that, and never first."
