Tax filing deadline nears

The April 15 deadline for filing state and federal tax returns is rapidly approaching.

However, Oregonians who do not have a tax liability can obtain an automatic 60-day filing extension simply by submitting a special form to the Internal Revenue Service.

The form, IRS Form 4868, "Application for Automatic Extension of Time to File U.S. Individual Income Tax Return," grants an additional 60 days in which to file the return.

However, IRS stresses that this is not an extension of time for payment of taxes due. Those persons who expect to owe a tax must compute the expected balance due and send that amount with the form to avoid interest and late payment penalties.

On the other hand, those

taxpayers who do not expect to owe additional tax or who are entitled to refunds, are not required to make any payment with the extension application. The extension is still required as a matter of law.

As the deadline for filing approaches, all IRS offices

throughout Oregon will be open to provide assistance to taxpayers preparing their federal income tax returns, particularly next Wednesday, April 15.

Also, toll-free telephone assistance will be available, 221-3960.

Traffic toll matches '80

Thirty-eight persons died in Oregon traffic accidents during March, a drop of nearly 26 percent from March last year when 51 persons were killed in traffic.

Despite the March toll, however, the 1981 count reached 126 during the month — the same number of traffic deaths recorded through March a year ago.

Fourteen March deaths resulted from non-collision accidents in which a driver

lost control of a vehicle, causing it to leave the road.

Eight other victims died in head-on collisions with other vehicles; four pedestrians were killed in traffic accidents, including one victim who was struck while attempting to change a tire on a vehicle parked along a highway shoulder.

Four motorcyclists were killed in March. None were reported as wearing a helmet.
