

# Casserole helps stretch family beef budget

## Ground Beef Oriental

2 onions, chopped  
1 cup sliced celery  
2 tbsp. butter  
¾ cup regular rice, uncooked  
1 pound ground beef  
1 can cream of chicken soup  
1 can cream of mushroom soup  
1½ cans water  
¼ cup soy sauce  
¼ tsp. pepper  
1 pound bean sprouts  
1 can water chestnuts, sliced

Brown onion and celery in butter; remove from pan. Brown rice and beef together in same pan. Combine soup, water, soy sauce

and pepper. Combine with first ingredients. Add water chestnuts and stir in bean sprouts gently.  
Bake uncovered at 350 for 30 minutes. Serves 6. From the files of Esther Johnson, Bothell, Wash.

## Cinnamon Rolls

¼ cup warm water  
1 package yeast granules  
1 cup scalded milk  
1 tsp. salt  
1-3 cup shortening, melted  
3 cups sifted flour  
1-3 cup sugar  
1 egg, beaten

Dissolve yeast in warm water. Add scalded milk cooled to lukewarm. Then add shortening, sugar and beaten egg. Add half the flour and beat well. Add remaining flour and let rise once. Beat down and let rise again.

Roll out on floured board in a rectangular shape ¼ inch thick. Spread with melted butter. Then spread on brown sugar. Sprinkle with cinnamon. Roll on raisins or currants which have been plumped in hot water and drained.

Roll up and cut into one-inch bits. Let rise and bat at 425 for almost 12 minutes. A powdered sugar glaze may be added when the rolls have slightly cooled.

## Lemon Crackle

Filling: 1 cup sugar

1 cup water

Combine sugar and water in a double boiler; boil and thicken with 2 tbsp. cornstarch, ¼ cup butter, 2 eggs, juice from 2 lemons and ½ tsp. vanilla. Cool.

Crust and topping:

1 cup brown sugar  
½ cup butter  
1 cup flour  
½ tsp. soda  
10 soda crackers, crushed  
1 cup nuts, chopped  
1 cup coconut

Mix above ingredients and put half into a greased 9 X 13" pan; cover with cooled filling and sprinkle the remainder of crumb mixture on top. Bake at 375 for about 30 minutes.

## Carnival nets \$2,400

A carnival Saturday at Boring's Naas Grade School netted the school some \$2,400 after expenses.

Part of the proceeds from the carnival, and an earlier paper drive, will go toward the purchase of gymnastic mats for the school. The

school board will convene May 4 to decide what to do with the rest of the money. "It went an hour over what we expected," said organizer Linda Mann, head of the local Parent-Teacher Association. "The kids really enjoyed it."

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## Deputies to drive roomier Malibu cars

Tired of their "imprisonment" in the small Chevrolet Citations purchased last year, Clackamas County sheriff's deputies will soon drive around in roomier Chevrolet Malibus.

The Malibu sedans are expected to arrive in about five months, according to Sheriff Paul McAllister. They will cost \$6,864 each, which is \$22 less than the cost of the Citations last year.

Deputies have complained that the six-cylinder Citations are easily out-distanced during high-speed chases, have back seats too small for the easy placement of prisoners, present too much of a safety hazard in the event of an accident and are simply too small for some officers.

While policies won't allow pursuits at excessive speeds, "you have to have the tools for the job," said

McAllister. Growing public awareness of the deputies' slow cars could mean more attempts to elude officers, he said.

County commissioners were finally convinced to authorize buying the bigger Malibus on the grounds they are better for police work, McAllister continued.

The Malibus, complete with air conditioning, bucket seats and other police-package equipment, are being purchased for a \$600-\$700 savings through the Oregon State Police. They will make up about half of the patrol car fleet, replacing the aging Plymouth Furries.

They get about 11 miles per gallon, as compared to the Citations' 13-18 mpg, the sheriff said.

The department's 17 Citations will be relegated to detectives and sergeants.

## Proposed cuts could cripple CCC programs

President Reagan's proposed cutbacks in federal financial aid programs could "severely limit" the finances of many Clackamas Community College students, says Eric Etzel, the college's student body president.

The proposed elimination of special loans and scholarships for health profession studies would also have a severe effect on students, he claims.

Etzel and CCC Financial Aid Director Dick Thompson have calculated that proposed cuts in the federal Basic Educational Opportunity Grant program alone means 117 CCC students would lose that source of financial aid.

The remaining 663 students eligible to receive basic grants would receive only 60 percent of their 1980-81 allotment, Etzel says. The average 1980-81 BEOG award was \$938, meaning the 1981-82 award could drop to \$562, he says.

Proposed cuts in the National Direct Student Loan program would reduce the average loan to CCC students from \$950 to \$500, or would result in 50 fewer students receiving NDSL loans, Etzel predicts. Similarly, reductions in the Guaranteed Student Loan program, which serves students not eligible for other forms of financial aid, would be greatly reduced, he says.
