

## Trillium Lake sets opener on April 24

One of the Mt. Hood area's most popular spots, Trillium Lake, will open to the public April 24.

The Trillium Lake Campground will operate at a "reduced service" level, however, due to a budget-tightening process of the U.S. Forest Service. Reduced service means that no drinking water or garbage pickup will be provided. No fee will be charged until the Forest Service reinstates full service.

Full service, including drinking water, garbage pickup and toilet and site maintenance will begin May 22. At that time, a fee of \$4 per campsite will be assessed.

Green Canyon, Riley Horse Camp and McNeil Campgrounds, as well as the Clear Creek and Lost Creek picnic areas will open May 8 with reduced service. Full service will be provided to the campgrounds May 22 when a fee will be charged. That fee will be \$3 a campsite at Green Canyon and Riley Horse Camp and \$2 a campsite at McNeil.

Still Creek Campground will open with full service and a \$3 fee June 15.

Tollgate and Camp Creek campgrounds will open May 22 and operate on a reduced service basis all season. No fees will be charged.

These opening dates are all tentative. Campers should check with the Zigzag Ranger Station before visiting. The station is open seven days a week, from 7:45 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

# Sandy blanks Molalla

Putting together one of its best efforts of the season, the Sandy High girls tennis team blanked Molalla 7-0 Monday in a Timber Valley League match.

Beating the Indians was an early-season goal of Sandy coach Debbie Hunter, but not even Hunter thought that the victory would come by shutout.

In fact, just two matches went to three sets and the Pioneers won the deciding set in both cases by a 6-0 score.

At No. 1 singles, Sandy Yantes dominated Molalla's Jackie Stafford, winning 6-0, 6-1. Yantes' teammate, Tami Shafer, handled her opponent with the same ease, beating Janet Peters by an identical score, 6-0, 6-1 at No. 2 singles.

The only close singles match came in the third and final contest. Sandy's Jody Robbins staged a strong come-from-behind rally to outlast Sandy Abraham 2-6, 6-4, 6-0. Robbins trailed 1-4 in the second set and was on the brink of elimination before rallying to win 11 straight games.

"That was kind of neat," Hunter said. "Jody's was the last match and she came back and won that last set. That gave us the shutout."

The Pioneers survived another three-set match in the No. 1 doubles contest as Sandy Shreeve and Julie Coleman toppled Joni Schaefer and Sharon Bergstrom 7-5, 4-6, 6-0.

Becky Rodrigues and Pat Wesselink beat Molalla's Bonnie Coates and Emily Friedrich 6-2, 6-2 at No. 2 doubles. In the third doubles match, Zina Seal and Sue Hartke knocked off Kay Schlimgin and Laura Novak 6-1, 7-5.

Sandy's Tracy Tool and Denise Shockey won the fourth and final doubles match, defeating Denise Lichty and Bonnie Ogren 6-4, 6-1.

Unfortunately for the Pioneers, they pulled

a nosedive the next day against Silverton and suffered a 4-3 loss to the Foxes. They also completed the final couple matches of a match postponed earlier against Silverton and lost that too, also by a 4-3 score.

Sandy swept the singles competition Tuesday, but went 0-for-4 in the doubles matches. Yantes beat Tracy Hayes 6-0, 7-5; Shafer blanked Diana Ricketts 6-0, 6-0; and Robbins topped Cindy Hettwer 6-3, 6-1.

The name Hettwer came back to haunt the Pioneers, however. Teresa and Kathy Hettwer teamed up at No. 1 doubles and dealt Shreeve and Coleman a 5-7, 6-0, 7-6 loss. They also won the makeup match from the first round.

At No. 2 doubles, Julie Ertelt and Chris Hammer of Silverton scored a 6-4, 6-4 win over Rodrigues and Wesselink. Hartke and Seal took their match to three sets before losing at No. 3 doubles to Chris Fisher and Jennifer Doane 6-3, 5-7, 6-1.

Schoepert and Shockey were beaten at No. 4 doubles 6-2, 6-1 by Kelly Holt and Ronnie Schiedler.

Silverton won the makeup match as well. Rain had forced the two teams to postpone the conclusion of an earlier contest after most of the matches had already been played. Again, Sandy swept the singles and got skunked in the doubles, a different story than earlier in the season when the doubles teams carried the Pioneers.

The next match for Sandy will be this Thursday, when league power Estacada comes to town for a 4 p.m. match. Sandy upset the Rangers 4-3 earlier in the season and Estacada has been pointing for the rematch for the past several weeks.

Sandy will also have a rematch with Molalla, traveling to the Indians' courts Monday. That match will also begin at 4 p.m.

# Pioneer wrestlers nab titles

Three Sandy High School wrestlers fared well in recent post-season action.

Sophomore Larry Topliff won the 106-pound division of the Oregon Open Freestyle championships. Topliff was the only high school wrestler to win and was voted the outstanding high school wrestler at the tournament.

Topliff beat three opponents to win the crown. The SUHS soph topped Troy Hannemann of the Rose City Raiders by pin in 45 seconds,

nipped John Wachmuth of Club U.S.A. Oregon 9-6 and decisive Randy Santibanez 14-11. Santibanez, a 22-year-old, competes for the University of Oregon Wrestling Club.

Topliff also won the Sambo competition which combines wrestling and judo. He pinned Hannemann and Tim Stewart of U.S.A. Oregon.

The meet was held at Clackamas Community College.

Another SUHS wrestler,

junior Chris Jones, won the 154-pound division of the Western Regional Championships. Jones had already won the Oregon state competition.

The regionals featured wrestlers from California, Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Utah and Nevada. Jones twice pinned the state champion from California and flattened the Washington state champ once. He was undefeated in his weight class.

Also competing at the regionals was Sandy High's Dan Martin. The Pioneer junior placed third in the 165-pound division.

At the recent SUHS wrestling banquet, Martin and Jones were voted Outstanding Wrestlers. Jones was named Most Inspirational Wrestler and Martin was the Most Improved Wrestler.

The Outstanding Freshman award went to Loren Bateman.
