Book review:

How to 'prep' for your life

According to "The Official Preppy Handbook," edited by Lisa Birnbach, the word "preppy" is derived from "preposterous."

What is a Preppy? He's a guy who dresses perfectly without trying to. He appears to do everything well. Just like Oliver Barrett IV, the protagonist of Erich Segal's best-selling 1970 novel, "Love Story."

Eastern Preppies are the most rigid and when they are vibrating at the proper frequency, you cannot understand them — but they understand each other.

Birnbach has defined the

intricacies of each proper accent: Boston Brahmin, New England Nasal Nip, Locust Valley Lockjaw, Manhattan Neutral Express, Madeira-Foxcroft Stratford-on-Potomac Patter, Virginia Redneck Boy Drawl, Grosse Pointe Monotone, Chicago-Colorado Hybrid, Hockaday (and Highland Park) Heightened Harmony.

Arbor Day celebration next Friday

Arbor Day is next Friday, April 24, and Oregonians are being urged by State Forester Mike Miller and Superintendent of Public Instruction Verne Duncan to recognize the benefits of Oregon's forests on that special day.

By Oregon law, the last Friday of April each year is designated Arbor Day. The purpose is to make citizens better aware of the benefits of forests.

Students, in particular, are asked to participate in activities during school hours that encourage tree planting, protection and preservation of trees and shrubs, and a greater understanding of the environment.

"Here in Oregon we live in a world of forests," Miller said. "We should take a moment to appreciate how these trees support our state's economy and offer the many other benefits that we all enjoy, including scenery, recreation, wildlife, fish and water."

Miller said that public and private forestry organizations are available to assist schools and other organizations in local Arbor Day programs.

"Teachers are being asked to include special studies or programs in observance of Arbor Day," Duncan said.

Canada, Great Britain, Spain France and Norway.

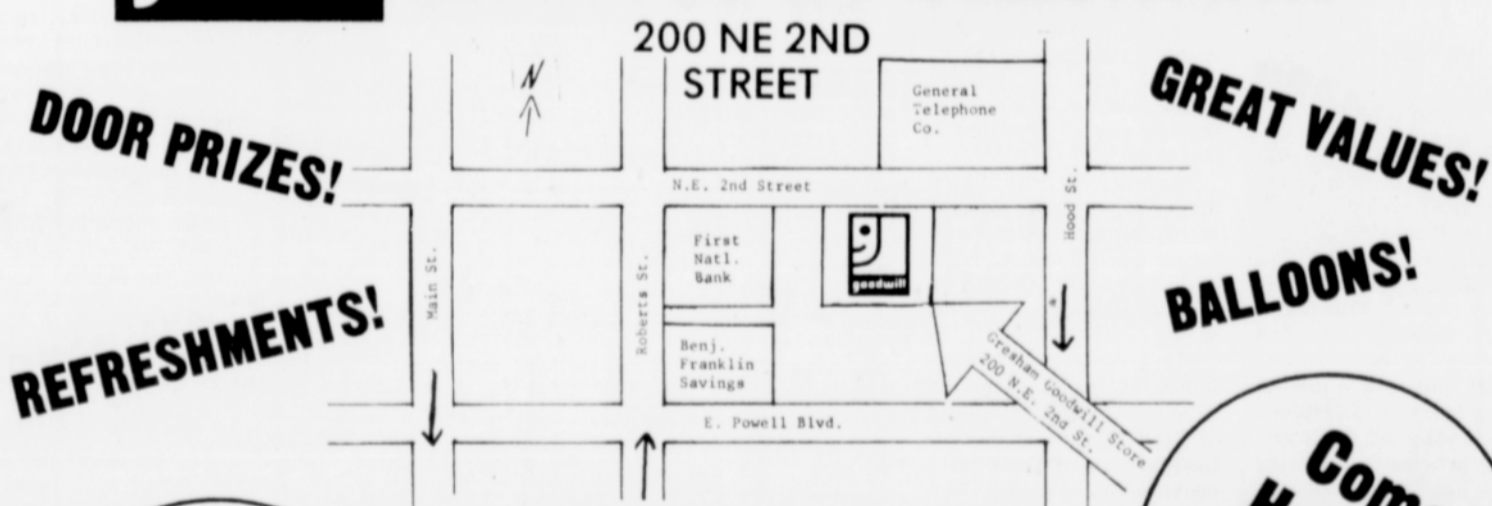
"Arbor Day is not like any other holidays," Morton once reflected. "Each of those reposes on the past, while Arbor Day proposes on the future."


