NOTICE OF ELECTION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that an election to be held on Tuesday, May 19, 1981, between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M., there will be submitted to the qualified voters of the following districts the following questions:

SANDY UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2 OPERATING "A" LEVY

QUESTION: Shall Sandy Union High School District levy \$1,805,826.00 outside Oregon's Constitutional Limitation for operating expenses during fiscal year 1981-82?

PURPOSE: The purpose is to fund the educational program and needs adopted by the District for the students, grades nine through twelve.

EXPLANATION: The District's tax base does not provide adequate funds for the educational program required by statute and adopted by the District Board; therefore, voter approval of an operating levy is presented to the District voters each year.

If this measure is approved, \$2,101,914.00 of taxes levied will be financed partially by the State of Oregon, which includes the \$296,088.00 tax base. The estimated levy will be \$3.77 per \$1,000.00 assessed value, or 41% less than the 1980-81 levy, exclusive of levies for bonded indebtedness.

SANDY ELEMENTARY DISTRICT #46 OPERATING LEVY "B"

QUESTION: Shall Sandy Elementary School District #46 levy \$197,716 outside Oregon's Constitutional limitation for operating expenses during the fiscal year 1981-82?

PURPOSE: The purpose is to fund the continuation of existing educational programs and support services for children of the district grades one to eight.

EXPLANATION: The District does not have a tax base to provide the existing program, therefore, voter approval of this operating levy is presented to the District voters.

If this measure is approved, \$197,716.00 of taxes levied will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial state payment.

BULL RUN SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 45 OPERATING LEVY

QUESTION: Shall Bull Run School District levy \$28,444 outside Oregon's Constitutional limitation for operating expenses during fiscal year 1981-82?

PURPOSE: The purpose is to fund the current educational programs and related services for children of the district Grades One through Eight.

EXPLANATION: This levy is needed to provide the educational program and related services required by statute and adopted by the district board.

If this measure is approved, \$28,444 of taxes levied will be financed partially by the State of Oregon.

WELCHES ELEMENTARY NO. 13 OPERATING LEVY "A"

QUESTION: Shall Welches Elementary School District levy \$21,454.00 in excess of the statutory limitation for an operating levy for 1981-82?

PURPOSE: These funds are to provide for the continuation of programs for the Welches School District.

EXPLANATION: The district's tax base does not provide sufficient funds to support the district's programs.

If this measure is approved \$21,454 of taxes levied will be financed partially by the State of Oregon. The levy would cost approximately 13¢ per \$1,000 evaluation before tax relief.

WELCHES SCHOOL DISTRICT 13 OPERATING LEVY "B"

QUESTION: Shall Welches Elementary School District levy \$185,023 in excess of the statutory limitation for an operating levy for 1981-82?

PURPOSE: These funds are to provide for the continuation of programs for the Welches School District.

EXPLANATION: The district's tax base does not provide sufficient funds to support the district's programs.

If this measure is approved, \$185,023 of taxes levied will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial state payment. The levy would cost approximately \$1.09 per \$1,000 evaluation.

Herbicide program to focus on danger

Rep. Jim Weaver, D-Ore., last week sent telegrams to Secretary of the Interior James Watt and Secretary of Agriculture John Block urging them to immediately cancel all aerial herbicide spray programs on federal forest lands and substitute manual brush control.

"Oregon urgently needs jobs," Weaver said in his telegrams. "Our economic situation is desperate and many citizens are literally up in arms over planned spray actions."

"Testimony to my Forests Subcommittee Thursday indicates we could not only create hundreds of new jobs with manual methods, but also in many cases do the job better and cheaper using

people instead of chemicals," Weaver said.

Watt oversees the Bureau of Land Management and Brock oversees the U.S. Forest Service.

Weaver held a hearing Thursday in Eugene on his bill which would require the Forest Service and BLM to choose vegetation management methods that would "yield the maximum number of jobs per dollar expended."

"Testimony at Thursday's hearing showed clearly that in many cases manual methods are not only more effective they are also less expensive," Weaver said. "And that's without even considering the money the government would save

because of eliminated unemployment and welfare payments to those who would be put back to work."

The Sandy Community School will host a forum May 19, featuring two of the state's leading experts on the effects of herbicide spraying and a representative of the State Highway Department which does

roadside spraying. Dr. Jim Witt, Oregon State University biochemist and toxicologist, and Dr. Sheldon Wagner, a toxicologist at Good Samaritan Hospital in Corvallis, will discuss the potential medical problems which arise with continued spraying of toxic herbicides.

Wagner is attempting to establish a statewide program for physicians to test blood levels for damaging amounts of herbicide in the bloodstream.

Joe Hay, of the State Highway Department in Salem, will present a slide show on that agency's spray operation.

The program will be held from 7 to 9 p.m. support staff and administrators.

Parents may call for an appointment, 668-8011, or may simply drop in. Students will not attend school during conference day.

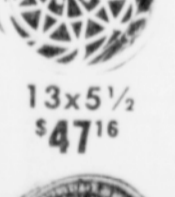

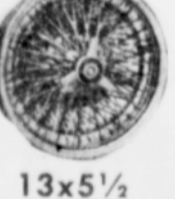
