The drug awareness forum scheduled tonight, April 30, has been postponed due to a conflict in schedules. The forum will now be held May 19.

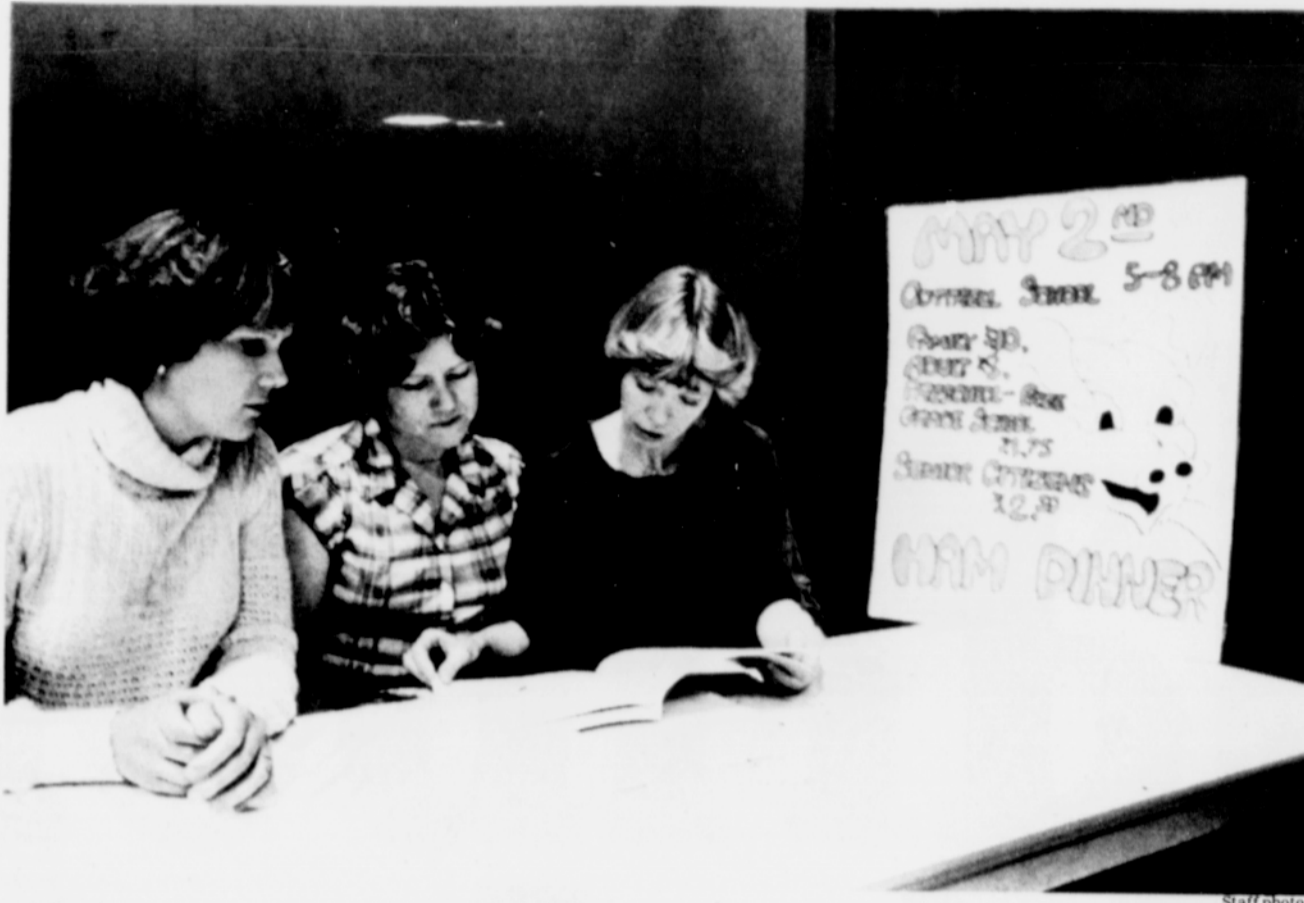
The seminar's format will be a panel discussion with four professionals sharing their knowledge of the drug situation with parents. A question and answer period will follow.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION CITY OF SANDY, OREGON

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, May 19, 1981, there will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Sandy in a special election within the corporate boundaries of the City of Sandy, Oregon, for their approval or rejection a certain question, the ballot title of which is designated as follows: **BALLOT A. SPECIAL LEVY PARTIALLY STATE FINANCED FOR CITY BUDGET QUESTION:**

Shall the City of Sandy be authorized a \$319,869.96 special property tax levy for 1981-82 outside the constitutional limits?

PURPOSE:
This measure, which would be partially State financed, if approved, will authorize the City of Sandy to levy property taxes of \$319,869.96 in excess of the six (6%) percent limitation set forth in Article XI, Section 11 of the Oregon State Constitution. This amount is required to meet a portion of the costs of operation for the department functions of the City of Sandy, Oregon, for the fiscal year 1981-82 which begins July 1, 1981.

EXPLANATION:
The proposed total tax levy to support the operations of the City for fiscal year 1981-82 is \$333,212.00, which exceeds the City authorized tax base for that period by \$319,869.96. The proposed total tax levy is entirely within State Ballot A limitations. The authorized tax base of \$13,342.04 may be levied without further approval by the voters.

This measure will authorize a levy of \$333,212.00 which includes the authorized tax base. If this measure is approved the entire property tax levy of \$333,212.00 will be partially financed by the State of Oregon which will result in an estimated rate of \$4.50 per \$1000 of true cash value exclusive of levies for bond principal and interest. This compares with an actual tax rate for fiscal year 1980-81 of \$4.51 per \$1000 of true cash value.

Volume covers much of nation's past

"The Amazing Twentieth Century — And Other Stories," by Robert and Edna Roduner, is a slim volume that condenses the major

changes in the past 80 years — from the development of automobiles to space exploration.

The changes in living conditions is portrayed in two true stories as described by Robert Roduner: "The County Schoolteacher" and

"The Marine Farmer," a World War II marine that tried farming in Oregon.

In "The House by the Side of the Road," Edna Roduner describes a pioneer community in New Mexico in the days before modern conveniences.

This is a good book for students — everything is compact and ready to go — "no frills, just bare facts." Other new books at Sandy Public Library include "After Dark" by Manley Wellman, "Trading in Gold" by Paul Sarnoff, "Locked Jaws: Journal of a Dieter" by Nick Lyons and "Inflation-proofing Your Investments" by Harry Browne.

Road improvements delayed

Road improvements planned for the Tower Drive residential area in Boring have been delayed because a bill being considered in the Oregon Legislature could make the improvements more costly.

That bill would remove the present 10 percent limit on interest rates charged for money borrowed by local governments for public improvements, said Winston Kurth, director of Clackamas County's Department of Environmental Services.

Because local homeowners could possibly end up paying more for improvements than they had expected, the county has

decided to mail letters about the bill's implications to them before going ahead with the work, Kurth said.

A local improvement district for the area has been in the works since December, when a majority of homeowners petitioned county commissioners to approve the work.

The petition requested that S.E. 257th Drive be upgraded to county standards — including widening, paving and the addition of curbs — and that the remaining roads be upgraded but maintained by the local homeowners' association. Those roads include Tower Drive, Alice Court, Castle Court, S.E. 285th Place and S.E. Yahweh

Lane. Estimated cost of the improvements is \$600,000, which would be assessed against local property upon completion of the work, sometime around January 1983, Kurth said.

"Because of this legislation, we didn't want to go ahead with the improvements," he said. "We felt it best to contact them again to see if they still want to go through with it, despite a possible 11 percent or higher interest rate."

Letters will be mailed to residents next week, he said. If they still opt for the improvements, work would probably begin in July.
