**Glenn Turner**

Funeral services for Glenn Gilbert Turner were held Monday in the Autumn Chapel in Gresham. He died from a heart attack May 1. He was 82.

Born and raised in Washington, he enlisted in the U.S. Navy when he was 20. He served during World War I until 1919. After his discharge he worked as a musician on the West Coast, including a four-year stint as a background musician in Walt Disney movies.

He re-enlisted in the Navy in 1940, serving in the 11th Naval District in San Diego, Calif., until 1945. Upon his discharge he worked in civil service at Moffet Field in Sunnyvale, Calif. His wife, Virginia, died in 1967.

He moved to the Portland area in 1970.

He is survived by his son, William M. Asher of Brightwood; a sister, Ima Jean of San Jose, Calif.; three grandsons, and four great-grandchildren.

Burial was at Golden Gate National Cemetery in San Bruno, Calif.

**Marie Olson**

Graveside services for Sandy resident Marie Olson were held Saturday at Forest Lawn Cemetery in Gresham. She died April 29 in a Portland hospital after a lingering battle with cancer. She was 51.

Born in Shroud, Okla., she moved to the Newberg area in 1944. In 1955 she moved to Eastern Washington before settling in Sandy in 1960.

She married Harlan Olson on Feb. 27, 1961, in Stevenson, Wash. Mrs. Olson owned and operated a beauty shop in Sandy.

She is survived by her husband, Harlan of Sandy; three daughters, Carol Zimmerly of Zigzag, Shirley Reams of Boring and Nancy Olson of Milwaukie; his father, Thomas Thompson of Sandy; six brothers, Max of Portland, Sherman of Beaverton, Jack, Oval, Floyd and Lloyd, all of Molalla; two sisters, Joyce Johnson of Portland and Ruth Cole of Roseburg, and eight grandchildren.

**Mervil Kirby**

Funeral services for Mervil Kirby were held Monday in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. Vault interment was at Firhill Memorial Cemetery in Sandy. He died in a Portland hospital April 30. He was 67.

Born in Arma, Kan., he moved to Texas after he completed his schooling. He was employed in the construction industry in Texas.

Mr. Kirby moved to Oregon in 1942 where he began his career with Reynolds Metals Co. in Troutdale. He was a foreman in the potrooms. He retired in 1976 after 32 years with the company.

Services were held Wednesday at Bateman Funeral Chapel for Elmer Schoenborn of Boring, who died Saturday. He was 66.

**Sheriff's deputies nab worker in murder try**

Clackamas County Sheriff's deputies last week arrested Arnulfo Salasai, 49, a Mexican employee at a farm in Boring, for attempted murder.

Masimino Salisar, a second Mexican employee of Fujimoto Farms, was reported in serious condition last Thursday in Gresham Community Hospital after the attempted murder.

The sheriff's report said that farm foreman Santiago Flores told deputies that one of the workers was angry because he did not have a cabin to himself, and walked into the cabin where Salisar was preparing food and stabbed him.

The report said the deputy found Salasai lying on the ground behind the cabins with blood on his clothes. He was treated at Willamette Falls Hospital in Oregon City for a broken nose and possible cheek bone fracture due to a fight after the stabbing.

Last Thursday two Sandy men were among those arrested following an attempted theft in Estacada.

Robert Wayne Johnston Jr., 21, of Wildcat Mountain Drive, Harvey Dean Kimery, 23, of Sandy, and Harvey William Hunt, 40, no address, were arrested together on a charge of attempted second-degree theft at Faraday Park in Estacada.

According to sheriff's department reports, the victim, a Portland resident, signed a citizens arrest statement after Kimery allegedly entered the victim's vehicle, ransacked it and attempted to take a CB radio, while the other two watched from a nearby vehicle.

Hunt was also arrested on a first-degree theft warrant from the sheriff's office, the report said.
