

Mandatory liability insurance law achieves goal

Oregon's mandatory automobile liability insurance law will be three years old in July and officials of the Motor Vehicles Division say the program is achieving its major goal — reducing the number of uninsured motorists on the highways.

"The percentage of uninsured drivers involved in accidents has dropped from about 14 percent to less than 5 percent," according to Jim Hunter, manager of DMV's Driver Services Branch. "That's a pretty good indication that the law is having an impact."

He said the statistics show that the law has had an effect on the number of traffic accidents involving uninsured drivers, even though

DMV still gets complaints from people who say they have been hit by someone with no insurance.

"The problem now is getting to the remaining uninsured drivers," Hunter said. "To get that at 4 or 5 percent, we would have to hassle a lot of people, and it would cost a great deal of money. We have to strike a balance somewhere."

The law was passed by the 1977 Legislature and took effect in July 1978. It requires drivers to have basic auto liability insurance. Coverage is certified when a vehicle registration is renewed.

When drivers renew their vehicle registrations, they sign a statement on the back

of the renewal card stating that an insurance policy is in force. It lists the insurance company and policy number.

This information is not used to enforce the law and is one reason DMV has asked the 1981 Legislature to drop the requirement as a budget-saving step.

VERIFICATION METHODS

The division has two ways to enforce the law by verifying insurance coverage.

First, a random sample process currently requires owners of 1 percent of registered motor vehicles to supply the name of their current insurance company and the policy number. The information is then verified

with the insurance company. The second method occurs when a driver is involved in an accident and files an accident report. Insurance coverage is checked with the company listed on the

report. A third verification method, in which insurance companies were required by law to notify DMV if a policy lapsed or was cancelled within 120 days of its effective

date, was eliminated by the 1979 Legislature after DMV discovered itself about to be buried in paper.

"It became one big bureaucratic mess," Hunter said. "A lot of times the

policy lapsed simply because people were shopping around, looking for a better deal, or they had sold the car, or changed cars."

The 1979 Legislature also increased the random sample allowed in the law to a maximum of 10 percent if needed to enforce the law.

Jay Rupp, manager of DMV's Support Services Section, said that while the division has the authority to increase the sample, it is still around 1 percent. To increase the sample would re-

quire added funding. "So far," Rupp said, "we do not believe we need to increase the sample size. We're watching the numbers of uninsured drivers in accidents — that's a pretty good indication of how many uninsured we have driving."

"As long as that number stays level — at about 4 percent — there's no need to increase the sample. If the figures start going up, however, that'll be our signal to increase the sample size."

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION CITY OF SANDY, OREGON

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, May 19, 1981, there will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Sandy in a special election within the corporate boundaries of the City of Sandy, Oregon, for their approval or rejection a certain question, the ballot title of which is designated as follows:

BALLOT A. SPECIAL LEVY PARTIALLY FINANCED FOR CITY BUDGET QUESTION:

Shall the City of Sandy be authorized a \$319,869.96 special property tax levy for 1981-82 outside the constitutional limits?

PURPOSE: This measure, which would be partially State financed, if approved, will authorize the City of Sandy to levy property taxes of \$319,869.96 in excess of the six (6%) percent limitation set forth in Article XI, Section 11 of the Oregon State Constitution. This amount is required to meet a portion of the costs of operation for the department functions of the City of Sandy, Oregon, for the fiscal year 1981-82 which begins July 1, 1981.

EXPLANATION: The proposed total tax levy to support the operations of the City for fiscal year 1981-82 is \$333,212.00, which exceeds the City authorized tax base for that period by \$319,869.96. The proposed total tax levy is entirely within State Ballot A limitations. The authorized tax base of \$13,342.04 may be levied with no further approval by the voters.

This measure will authorize a levy of \$333,212.00 which includes the authorized tax base. If this measure is approved the entire property tax levy of \$333,212.00 will be partially financed by the State of Oregon which will result in an estimated rate of \$4.50 per \$1000 of true cash value exclusive of levies for bond principal and interest. This compares with an actual tax rate for fiscal year 1980-81 of \$4.51 per \$1000 of true cash value.
