

## Solar tour highlights Sandy homes

The Sandy-Gresham area will host one of eight tours this Sunday featuring a cross-section of solar applications, wind systems and hydro power projects.

The self-guided Sandy tour, sponsored by the Columbia Solar Energy Association and OMSI Energy Center, will take place from 1 to 5 p.m. and feature the most diverse sampling of alternative energy ideas of any tour.

"Sandy is one of our most exciting tours including an envelope home, a passive solar home, active air

systems for space and water heating, active trickle flow system, two story greenhouse retrofit, a wind system and a hydro system," according to Nancy Benner of CSEA.

"We are really going to try to sell solar by offering the public excellent, polished, finished examples of solar buildings," she said. "We are specifically looking for new and exciting designs in passive solar retrofits and new construction, attractive window treatments, and innovative active and passive storage systems."

Sandy stops include one residence which features

passive solar home design.

The second stop features a hydro system. The system includes a water wheel with Dakota Sun and wind generator.

The final Sandy stop features a thermal envelope design in a passive solar home. (This home was featured in last week's edition of The Post.)

Gresham stops include an active air system for space and water heating with partial underground construction for cooling and insulation; an active trickle flow system for space and hot water heating with water tank and rock storage for

collectors, and slab storage for sunspace; and a passive solar system home design with direct gain indoor pool for storage and heating and 12-collector active drain-down solar system for pool heating.

In Troutdale, one stop features a two-story greenhouse retrofit.

A 10 kilowatt wind system will be available for inspection in Corbett.

### Traffic wrecks drop from toll one year ago

Thirty-eight people died in Oregon traffic accidents in April, a drop of nearly 33 percent from April last year when 57 people were killed in traffic.

The April toll brought the 1981 count to 164, a drop of 10 percent. The four-month toll last year was 183.

Five pedestrians were among the 38 April victims. Four motorcyclists, two of whom were wearing helmets, also died in April. The remaining victims were drivers or passengers in motor vehicles.
