Fun With Music growing rapidly

Fun With Music, a group of Boring music lovers, made a \$300 donation last week to the Oral Hull Foundation in Sandy.

The group's leader, Gordon Wight, presented the donation in a wrapped package of \$1 bills. The evening's events included a tour of the grounds and the Gardens of Enchantment.

Fun With Music was originated by Wight in 1972. While vacationing in Hawaii, he happened on a group of

native musicians wearing straw hats and playing music. He said he was "struck by the idea" to form a group of music lovers.

Within three days of return, Wight organized the first meeting at the Legion Hall and 54 people showed up.

By word of mouth, Fun With Music has grown by leaps and bounds and membership now stands at 600. Members live as far away as Washington and

California.

Wight said the sole purpose of the group is to "have fun and enjoy each other's company without malaise and to have a full voice (in group activities) and to have a share in the assets."

Fun With Music participates in many parades and celebrations, including the Sandy Mountain Festival, the Wilsonville Boones Ferry Days, the Estacada Timber Festival and the Tualatin Crowsdad

Festival.

A trailer is decorated for the events and a band plays country western music. Other group members dance on the street around the float.

Anyone above the age of 12 is welcome to join the group. Meetings are held every third Sunday of the month for a dance at the Boring Grange Hall.
