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Oregonians fill duty with the Guard

More than 800 persons from western Oregon are in the middle of 15 days of active duty in Gowan Field, Idaho, as part of their Oregon National Guard training.

Commander Brig. General David Nudo of Portland said that the Idaho site was selected because it was the best place to train on crew-served weapons. The National Guard sent artillery, tanks, mortars, anti-tank missiles and machine gun crews to the desert facility.

Support crews came from many companies and included helicopters, medics, administrative people, engineers, supply, maintenance and others. The main body of the brigade and two infantry

battalions are scheduled to train this July at Camp Rilea on the Oregon coast.

Another infantry battalion

from southern Oregon will travel to Camp Roberts in California for Army War Games in August.

A small donation will be taken at the door.

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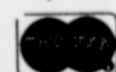
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
