The Clackamas County Assessor's office is in the process of a physical reappraisal of all real property in the Sandy, Cottrell, Boring, Bull Run, Welches and Orient school districts.

State law requires one of six sections of the county to be physically appraised every six years. These areas were last appraised in 1976.

According to George Malin, assessor, appraisals will be in the area for the next six to eight months visiting and inspecting all properties to establish their fair market value for the 1982-83 tax roll.

## Mt. Hood site gets listing as historic place

The Clackamas Lake Ranger Station Historic District near Government Camp has been entered in the National Register of Historic Places.

The National Register of Historic Places is a program of the Office of Archeology and Historic Preservation within the Heritage and Recreation Service of the U.S. Department of the Interior.

Listing in the National Register makes the property owners eligible for federal grants-in-aid for preservation, administered by the state as part of its historic preservation program. In addition, it provides for limited protection by requiring comment from the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, an independent executive agency, on the effects of federally assisted projects on listed resources.

All areas within the National Parks System, together with those properties eligible for designation as National Historic Landmarks, are listed in the National Register.
