All went well

Take a young director who has never worked in television before, hand him a Shakespearean play that has an almost unequalled record of failure in performance, and give him six days in the studio to videotape it — without so much as an extra minute for a margin of error. Sure-fire recipe for disaster?

Elijah Moshinsky and the British critics who saw the production early this year don't think so. Moshinsky is the director for PBS' "All's Well that Ends Well," airing Monday, May 18 (local dates may vary; check listings) and he thinks all did go well, despite the play's difficulties.

"The play shows us an older generation with a real and whole view of life, and a younger generation who has lost it. The play ends without the young having gained any

wisdom at all — the weak shall inherit the earth. For a comedy, that's a pretty bleak conclusion, and that's one reason we tried to make the play so beautiful visually."

Tony Randall returns

Emmy-winner Tony Randall returns to network television next fall as the star of a new comedy series, "Sidney Shorr." Randall will play an artist with an advertising agency who has a platonic relationship with a woman half his age and her daughter. Their relationship develops to the point where Shorr raises his friend's daughter as his own.

"I am terribly proud of the movie 'Sidney Shorr,'" says Randall, who played the character in a new movie that Warner Bros. produced for NBC for broadcast next season, before the series starts. "It is so different. A

few years ago, a friend gave me a three-page treatment for the movie and I fell in love with the lead character."

Peril on the set

Sarah McDavid is a fictional teacher who suffered the perils of a career in a dangerous inner city school.

Actress Patty Duke Astin learned something about that danger in real life. Mrs. Astin stars as Sarah in CBS' "The Violation of Sarah McDavid," to air Tuesday, May 19. The school scenes were filmed on location in an abandoned junior high school in a high-crime neighborhood in southern California. The grounds were patrolled by a dozen armed guards to protect the cast and crew.

But time and again filming was interrupted as the premises were searched for intruders who had eluded the guards. Usually, after being

apprehended, they were found to be carrying weapons ranging from knives to guns.

"It didn't make for peace of mind," says Mrs. Astin.

Spotlight on Burns

The flashbulbs popped, the photographer's spotlights shined in his face, and still George Burns smiled, his round black glasses perched evenly on his nose, the famous cigar between his fingers.
