Income tax errors can be easily fixed

What do you do when you discover you forgot to include an income or deduction item on your federal income tax return?

According to the Internal Revenue Service, it's time to file an amended return, Form 1040X.

Amended returns correct errors on previously filed returns. They can be filed within three years following the original due date (including extensions), or within two years after actual payment, whichever is later.

If a refund is due, the IRS will usually pay interest at the annual rate allowed by law during the interim. Likewise, if the individual owes tax, the IRS will charge interest at the same rate.

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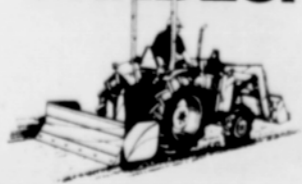
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
