'Forum' closes Saturday

Some of the best entertainment in the Portland-metropolitan area this weekend will occur in Sandy.

The hilarious Broadway musical "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum" plays Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings at 8 p.m. in the Sandy Community Theatre on Proctor Boulevard.

Herbicide forum Tuesday

A bill currently before the U.S. Congress, introduced by Rep. Jim Weaver, D-Ore., would provide for the safe use of herbicides on public forest lands for vegetation management and other purposes.

The use of herbicides along public roadways, particularly Highway 26, has created strong feelings locally regarding spray drift and the need for alternative means of controlling unwanted roadside vegetation.

A panel discussion this Tuesday, May 19, at 7:30

p.m. in the Sandy Community School trailer will tackle those questions and discuss the possible dangers arising from the use of toxic herbicides.

Dr. Jim Witt, an Oregon State University scientist, will discuss the herbicide 2-4-D and control experiments. Dr. Sheldon Wagner, also an OSU scientist and staff member at Good Samaritan Hospital in Corvallis, will discuss toxicity, its effects and keeping records of possible ill effects induced by spray.

Joe Hay, head of the State Highway Department in Salem, will present the road department's side of the issue, as well as possible alternatives, such as alternative planting adjacent to highway roadbeds.

A representative of Coffey Laboratories will offer tests of food, soils, water and blood and discuss services which the laboratory provides.

Following a one-hour general discussion by the panelists, there will be a question and answer period.
