

# ESD students embark on coast trip

Students from the Clackamas County Education Service District's (ESD) work experience program will get some play experience as well.

The group is planning a year-end beach trip. Four dozen students in the program come from classes run by the ESD for trainable mentally retarded students. Though the trip has a recrea-

tional side, it will also be a learning experience, according to Scott Burks, one of the program coordinators.

Burks said that many of the TMR students don't get as many opportunities for experiences such as a beach trip as other students.

"In fact, for some it will be the first time away from home and family for an overnight trip," Burks said. "A

trip like this gives the students a chance to practice many of the self-help skills they learn in the classroom, such as how to care for themselves, take responsibility, plan ahead and relate to peers in a socially acceptable way."

About 45 students will go on the beach trip, scheduled May 27-29 at Camp

Magruder just north of Tillamook.

The trip is funded in part by the ESD, but much of the financial support came from fundraising projects the TMR students were involved in, such as a bake sale and a garage sale.

The students, ESD staff and parents have been plan-

ning the trip for the past month. This is the third annual beach trip for students in the TMR work experience program.

Students in the class suffer from a variety of handicaps, including moderate to severe retardation, blindness, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, heart defects and hearing impairment.

# Forest service increases map prices

The U.S. Forest Service is increasing the cost of its maps from 50 cents to \$1.

The increase is effective immediately.

Citing rising costs of printing and administering the distribution, Forest Service officials authorized the increase for visitor and wilderness maps.

Mailed requests postmarked before May 18 will be honored at the old price. The price hike is the first since the map sale program was

begun in January of 1976.

Funds received from the map sales have been earmarked for reprinting and updating existing maps and producing new ones.

In Oregon and Washington, maps for sale include the visitor maps of the 19 National Forests and these wilderness areas — Eagle Cap, Glacier Peak, Goat Rocks, Kalmiopsis, Mt. Hood, Mt. Jefferson, Mt. Washington, Three Sisters and the newly-published "Mount St. Helens and Vicinity" map.

# CETA jobs open to youths

Clackamas County CETA is taking applications for a Summer Youth Employment Program which will begin June 1.

The program provides summer jobs for low-income youths ages 14 to 21. Priority will be given to Clackamas County residents. Applications are available in most county high schools or in the Clackamas County CETA office.

Youths will be placed with public and private non-profit agencies for up to 40 hours a week at \$3.35 an hour from June 1 to Sept. 30. The jobs provide well supervised work experience and gives the youths an opportunity to learn job skills and develop good work habits.

Examples of available summer jobs include forestry aide, clerical workers, park aides, landscape workers and records clerk. A CETA counselor will work with each youth in matching them up with an appropriate job, then monitor their progress throughout the summer.

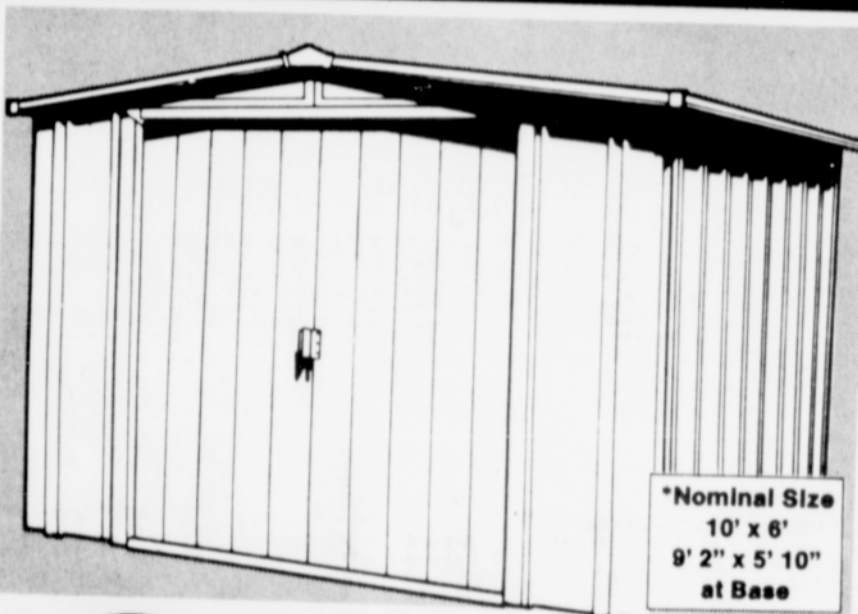

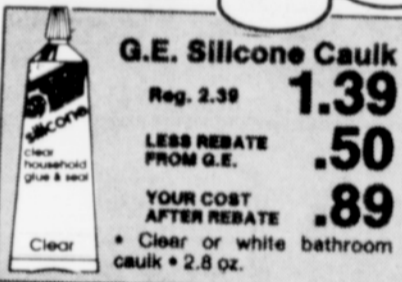

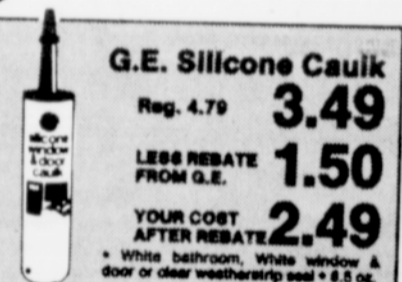
