

Hikers find each other before rescue

Two groups of climbers, lost in a Mount Hood "white-out," found each other last Saturday night before they were located by rescuers Sunday morning.

According to Clackamas County sheriff's deputies, the seven men and two women were found in the vicinity of Zigzag Canyon. All were in good condition.

Four of the climbers were driven out in snow vehicles. The rest hiked out, according to Deputy Mark White, who coordinated the search. Two of the men, Michael W. Clark, 20, and Douglas D. Smith, 19, both of the Portland area, were coming down the mountain's south slope when they encountered white-out conditions Saturday.

A third climber found his way down the mountain and reported that the other two were overdue at about 6 p.m., according to the sheriff's department spokesman.

A white-out is dense snow or fog that severely restricts visibility. When climbers and hikers on the south slope of the mountain run into this condition, they sometimes become disoriented and hike away from Timberline Lodge into the nearby Zigzag Canyon, according to Neal Reinsner, a sheriff's department community service officer.

The other group of five men and two women, who also had been on the south slope, failed to sign in at Timberline Lodge on time and were reported overdue at about 5:45 p.m. Saturday.

Variance plan for Hoodland to be studied

A variance application to allow a lot partition of land in the Hoodland area will be considered by the Clackamas County hearings officer this Monday, June 1, at 7 p.m. in the County Courthouse.
