Funeral services for former Sandy resident Delbert Gillum were held last Friday at the Bateman Funeral Chapel. Mr. Gillum died in a Portland hospital May 26. He was 78.

## Inspirational film set Sunday

"Reflections of His Love," a film highlighting the life and ministry of Joni Eareckson, will be shown this Sunday, June 7, at the Sandy Baptist Church, 34495 S.E. Jarl Road, at 6 p.m. Eareckson is the star of the recent movie, "Joni," which relates the story of her diving accident as a young girl which left her paralyzed from the neck down. It chronicles her struggles to piece together her life and

her faith in God, in spite of the circumstances.

In "Reflections of His Love," Eareckson, who is also the author of two best-selling books, "Joni" and "A Step Further," tells of the transformations that have taken place in her life because of her willingness to accept all of the things that have happened to her.

A remarkably talented young woman, Eareckson is an artist of great merit, as

well as an author, actress and singer. She has learned to draw and paint with a brush held in her mouth.

Her works have been displayed in major exhibitions, as well as on a number of network television programs. More recently, her illustrations and paintings have become the basis for a major line of greeting cards, plaques and framed prints.

According to the Rev. Ed Grable, senior pastor at San-

dy Baptist Church, "Reflections of His Love" introduces the viewer to the "real Joni Eareckson. We meet her parents, her sisters and her friends.

"We gain insight into the thoughts of the actors who played major roles in the movie, 'Joni,' and we learn of her new personal ministry, Joni and Friends."

Grable extended an invitation to the community to attend this special screening.

## Vacation Bible school nears

## Mt. Hood detour re-routed

The detour route, Cooper Spur Road, around the Highway 35 wash-out area on Mount Hood was closed to traffic beginning Monday, June 1.

According to Mike Stovall, Highway Division maintenance engineer, the closure was required to reconstruct the two and one-half miles of narrow, winding roadway which now carries a five-ton load limit.

The section of road closed

to traffic is between Cloud Cap Inn Road at Cooper Spur Inn, and Polallie Creek Campground.

Motorists will be able to access the roads to Cooper Spur Inn, Tilly Jane Campground and Cloud Cap Inn from the north end of the detour area.

The detour is expected to remain closed to traffic until Aug. 1, when that section of Cooper Spur Road can be opened to one-way traffic on-

ly, with up to one-hour delays possible.

Reconstruction of the roadway is expected to be completed sometime in mid-September. The detour will be opened then with no restrictions.

Replacing the section of Highway 35, washed out in a flood on Christmas Day, will take two years to complete, according to Stovall. Construction is expected to begin in the fall.
