Estimated tax payment due

Sandy area residents who are required to pay Oregon estimated tax must make second quarter payments by this Monday, June 15.

The estimated tax program requires some persons to estimate and pay part of their 1981 taxes during the year. The first-quarter payment was due April 15, with the second payment due this Monday. The remainder is due when the taxpayer files the regular income tax return in 1982.

The program includes people who expect to owe at least \$100 in state income tax when they file 1981 Oregon returns.

Three types of taxpayers may have to pay estimated tax: wage earners who don't have enough state tax withheld, self-employed persons who don't have withholding, and, those with other taxable income that is

not subject to withholding, such as pensions, dividends or interest. Social Security is not taxable.

Many people affected by the program received estimated tax packets earlier in the year. The packets include forms for both first- and second-quarter payments. Those

who need packets may pick them up at Oregon Department of Revenue offices or write to: Forms, Oregon Department of Revenue, State Office Building, Salem, OR 97310.

The program was established by the 1980 special session of the Legislature.

Crash kills woman, injures Sandy man

A 17-year-old Gresham woman was killed and two persons injured when a car spun out of control on Highway 26 early last Thursday morning.

Julie Johnson, 226 S.E. 188th Ave., was killed when the westbound car in which she was riding crossed the median about four miles east of Gresham and was struck by a car driven by a Sandy man.

The driver of the eastbound car, Wade James Deisher, 34, was taken by Lifeflight helicopter to Emanuel Hospital with multiple fractures. He is

listed in serious but stable condition, according to a hospital spokeswoman.

Riding in the car with Johnson was Danielle O'Neill, 17, 226 S.E. 188th Ave., Gresham. She was taken to Kaiser Sunnyside Medical Center and is in fair condition with "total body contusions and fractures," said the spokeswoman.

Johnson was originally mistakenly identified as Deborah Lynn Rich, 23, because of false identification she was carrying, said trooper Gary Lynn. Police were unable to determine who was driving the car.

The accident occurred about 2:30 a.m. last Thursday morning and demolished both cars, Lynn said. The accident is under investigation.

362nd Avenue improvements going to bid

Sandy area residents who drive 362nd Avenue regularly are getting some good news this week from the Oregon Department of Transportation. That road will get some improvements soon.

Bids will be received by the Oregon Transportation Commission Thursday, June 25.

The project involves grading and paving on 362nd Avenue at Skogan Road Section of Skogan, west of Sandy approximately one-half mile south of Highway 26. The project is 392 feet, and the paved width will be 30 feet. Completion time is 90 calendar days.

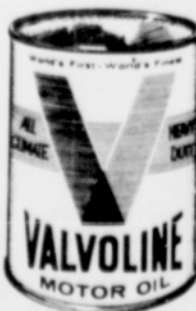

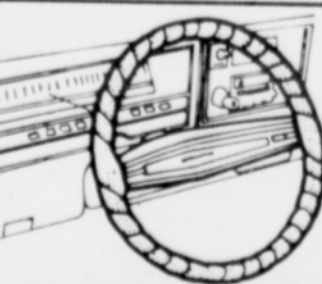
