Ian Woodward, a Welsh writer, has examined every possible explanation for the lycanthropy phenomenon. Spiritualism, theosophy, cannibalism, rabies, astral projection and psychiatric medicine are all explored in "The Werewolf Delusion."

The belief in the werewolf is traced from ancient Greece to modern times. It reached its peak during the Middle Ages. Stories of men capable of transforming themselves into animals, by sorcery, are found in the writings of Greek and Roman poets.

Many people today believe that the archetypal werewolf was a creature existing on "an astral level." This means that is a depraved person used the technique of

astral projection, his body could be seized upon by astral entities and materialized into that of an animal.

This would be a good time to mention that a buried werewolf or vampire must be pierced with an aspen stake if the creature is to meet its eternal end. I guess oak or maple stakes just irritate them.

## Senate OKs mandatory kindergarten

A bill passed last week in the Oregon Senate would require all school districts to establish kindergarten programs by July 1989.

Senate Bill 921, which was approved 16-13, now goes to the House for approval. Senators opposing the bill said it would inhibit local control and pose a financial burden on local taxpayers.

The Sandy Elementary School District has no kindergarten program. A kindergarten proposal was eliminated from the district's 'B' ballot proposal by the school board after the ballot was defeated in the March special election.

The Bull Run and Orient school districts also have no kindergarten programs.

Approximately one-half the districts in the state have kindergarten.

Sen. Ruth McFarland, D-Gresham, a co-sponsor of the bill, said studies presented during testimony before the Senate Education Committee showed

kindergartens are a cost-effective method of avoiding costly special education classes in later years.

Studies have shown that children who do not attend kindergarten are more likely to need remedial help, more likely to be held back a grade and more likely to not finish high school, McFarland said. And students who don't finish high school, she said, are more likely to commit crimes and be incarcerated in prison.

"Kindergarten is not a frill," said McFarland, an instructor at Mt. Hood Community College. "It's an integral, maybe crucial, part of the educational process." Sen. Jack Ripper, D-North

Bend, said the measure would force kindergarten programs on local taxpayers

when they are already free to establish those programs if they want to pay the cost.

## Variance plan to be studied at hearing

A variance application for property in the Sandy area will be considered by the Clackamas County hearings officer at 7 p.m. this Monday, June 15, in the County Courthouse.

Carl C. Leader is proposing to reduce the minimum lot size from five acres to 1.75 acres, to allow the partitioning of a 10-acre lots into two parcels of 1.75 acres and 8.25 acres.

The property is on the north and south sides of S.E. Cottontail Lane, at its intersection with S.E. Cottontail Drive. The area is zoned rural residential farm forest, five-acre minimum lot size.

Citizens are invited to attend this hearing. The hearings officer will consider all written and oral testimony.

The application is available for inspection at the Department of Environmental Services, Planning Division, 902 Abernethy Road, Oregon City.
