County seeking committee members

Clackamas County is seeking citizen volunteers to serve on the Solid Waste Commission and the Design Review Committee.

The Solid Waste Commission is seeking one citizen to serve with the seven current members, whose occupations include garbage franchise holders and county employees. The commission, which advises the Clackamas County Board of Commissioners on garbage collection rates and solid waste management, meets at 1:30 p.m. on the second Tuesday of each month. Terms are for four years.

Volunteers are also needed for the Design Review Committee, which offers professional advice on some com-

mercial, industrial and multi-family development proposals. The county is seeking a registered engineer to serve on the committee, which includes an architect, graphic designer, landscape ar-

chitect and representative of the development industry. The committee meets "on call" in the daytime, usually four hours each month. Appointments are for two-year terms.

Comprehensive plan under review

The State Juvenile Services Commission will meet in Bend this Thursday, June 18, to review the Clackamas County Comprehensive Juvenile Services Plan.

The meeting will begin at 9 a.m. at the Deschutes County Courthouse Annex.

Public testimony will be accepted at 1 p.m. from anyone wishing to provide input to the county's plan.

The plan was adopted by Clackamas County's local juvenile services commission, which was appointed by the Board of County Commissioners and the presiding juvenile court judge.

The 1979 Legislature passed the Community Juvenile Services Act, through which monies are distributed to counties on a child-population basis. Funds are

for the purpose of "developing and strengthening community-based programs for children and their families."

County gleaners eye sixth harvest

Low-income, senior and handicapped citizens of Clackamas County will be gleaned produce in the fields after the harvest this summer.

It will be the sixth year such a project has taken place in the county.

Since the U.S. Government's general accounting office has estimated that at

least 20 percent of crops are wasted, the Gleaners of Clackamas County have picked crops for their own families and for others who are physically unable to pick, that otherwise would have gone to waste.

Gleaners in Oregon picked more than one million pounds of produce in 1980, at a market value of more than

\$500,000.

The Gleaners of Clackamas County have incorporated and are applying for non-profit, tax-exempt status. As of September of this year, the group will no longer be directly funded by the Community Action Agency, which organized and supported the project since 1976.

Gleaners are able to offer

commercial growers a 10 percent tax credit on the wholesale value of produce donated. Gleaners also pick excess produce from smaller backyard gardens, which is considered a tax-deductible donation.

Scholarship offered to county students

Students from Clackamas County and three other metropolitan counties are eligible for the newly-established KGON Scholarship Fund.

The program is funded by KGON radio station. The scholarship fund provides assistance to students who reside in Clackamas, Multnomah, Washington or Clark Counties and are enrolled or plan to enroll as full-time college undergraduates in the field of broadcasting or journalism.

Selection is made on the basis of academic achievement, financial need and involvement in broadcast-related activities. Five scholarships will be awarded for the 1981-82 school year. The amount of the scholarships will be \$1,000 each or the sum of annual tuition and all required fees at the college, whichever is least.

A scholarship recipient may use the award at any public, private or generally accredited post-secondary

institution or at a vocational institution providing broadcasting or journalism training.
