Govt. Camp receives new phone service

A new telephone service in Government Camp will give residents time-saving, long distance direct dialing.

The Pacific Northwest Bell service is called "0 Plus" dialing, meaning that persons can dial direct on all long distance calls including collect, person-to-person and credit card calls.

"0 Plus" dialing is a feature of the new electronic operator assistance system that has been put into service in Government Camp.

The Traffic Service Position System (TSPS) also has a feature which is important in emergency situations. With the punch of a button, the operator can see the caller's number on a display screen and quickly route the call to the appropriate local emergency service.

Pacific Northwest Bell officials say the new electronic equipment will mean improved service and savings in operational costs.

Famous harpist to perform

A special dinner and concert will be presented this Saturday, June 27, at the Ivy Bear Restaurant at Alder Creek.

The concert will begin at 8 p.m.

County mulls animal killing methods

Clackamas County's use of a decompression chamber to kill unwanted animals was the topic of an emotional hearing last week.

The 90-minute meeting ended with commissioners delaying any decision about the chamber until they receive an opinion from the Attorney General's office on whether injections of sodium pentobarbital must be ad-

ministered by veterinarians. The drug is an alternative method to euthanasia.

During the meeting, a member of the Reach Out for Animals group was ordered to leave for profanity directed toward Commissioner Ralph Groener. The group has also waged campaigns against the use of decompression chambers in Multnomah and Washington

counties.

According to Chief Deputy District Attorney Ross Cravens, sodium pentobarbital must be injected by a veterinarian. The cost of hiring a full-time vet to give the shots would cost the county \$70,000 to \$80,000, an expenditure the county can't afford, the commissioners said.

But Joan Dahlberg, of the

Reach Out for Animals group, disputed Cravens' opinion, saying that the county's animal control director could dispense the drug if he was registered with the state.

Portland veterinarian Robert Fulton also disputed the opinion. He said the drug, which is a controlled substance, is administered by non-veterinarians throughout the state. He also

noted that some states allow animal shelters to use the drug without a vet present, although Oregon is not among those states.

Commissioners expressed concern over his testimony, saying there appears to be widespread illegal use of the drug.

"I personally support sodium pentobarbital," Groener said. "But I want to make sure it's done legally."

Timber plan under review

Preparation will begin soon for an environmental impact statement on the proposed timber management plan for the Clackamas County area and other areas of the Bureau of Land Management's local district.

A public meeting will be held July 14, at 7 p.m., in the Salem District office.

The purpose of the meeting is to obtain comments on which to base specific alternatives and to identify significant issues for discussion in the impact statement. The statement

will analyze the environmental effects of a proposed 10-year timber management plan and alternatives to the proposal for 159,000 acres of public land in the two units, located within Multnomah, Clackamas, Marion and Linn counties.

A sustained yield timber harvest level for the next decade has been proposed, along with management practices required to reach that level. Harvest would be primarily done by clearcutting, with some shelterwood cutting.

The environmental impact statement will identify impacts that can be expected from the proposed action of any of the alternatives. The statement will be completed in July 1982, and used to help make final decisions for managing timber resources in the units.
