4th of July fun set in Hoodland

A number of activities have been planned for the sixth annual Hoodland Chamber of Commerce July Fourth extravaganza.

Included on the agenda is a 10-kilometer fun run, a beer garden, food booths, an arts and crafts fair, live music and dancing and a community-wide picnic. The activities will be climaxed by a fireworks display.

The July Fly fun run, sponsored by the Hoodland Fire Department, will kick off the chamber's activities. It will be held at 1 p.m. July 4 near the Hoodland Women's Club on Salmon River Road. Registration fee is \$6.50 before the Fourth or \$7.50 the day of the race.

The beer garden and food and crafts booths will open at 2 p.m. beside the Women's Club. The beer garden will remain open until midnight; the crafts fair will run through 9 p.m.

The Bo Cody Band will perform from 6 to 9 p.m. and from 10 p.m. to midnight.

A colorful fireworks

display will begin at 9 p.m.

More than 1,500 persons turned out to enjoy the activities last year. Chamber sponsors have arranged a free shuttle service this year to help alleviate traffic problems.

Buses donated by Mt. Hood Meadows and Timberline Lodge will provide a shuttle service from the Hoodland Plaza shopping center in Wemme to the festivities on Salmon River Road, according to event coordinator Shirley Dueber.

In addition to the chamber-sponsored activities, the Hoodland Lions Club will host its annual July Fourth breakfast from 7 a.m. to noon at the Lions Club building in Wemme.

The Hoodland Women's Club will sponsor its annual rummage sale from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at its Salmon River Road building.

A Ski-Down will be held at Timberline Lodge, featuring skiers with colorful flares and smoke devices. It is scheduled for dusk.

Washout creates some travel misconceptions

The recent road closure signs necessitated by the washout of the Mt. Hood Highway (ORE 35) have created some misconceptions, according to Ed Hardt of the Highway Division.

The highway is open from the north to just south of the community of Mt. Hood. The road to Parkdale is open, and the road to Cooper Spur is open for some distance,

providing access to camping sites and businesses in the area. Many of those businesses are open.

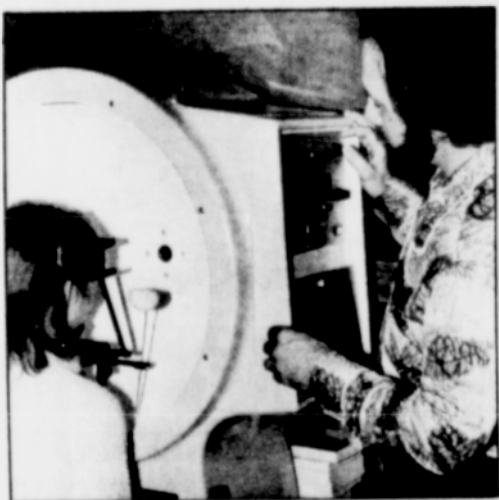
From the south, the highway is open to the Polallie Creek area. Some businesses and campsites in this area are also open.
