

Book review:

Biography traces musical world of Count Basie

"The World of Count Basie" by Stanley Dance is an oral history (a la Studs Terkel) with a rich flow of anecdote, opinion and biographical information. It is a valuable history of the musical beginnings of Kansas City Jazz to the present day. These musicians tell of their careers, the social and economic conditions under which they played, and their feelings about Basie and each other. There is a bibliography, a selected discography,

photographs and an index. Basie got his professional nickname from Dick Smith, an announcer. "We've got the Earl of Hines, the Duke of Ellington, the Baron of Lee and Paul Whiteman is the King of Jazz," he said. "So you be the Count with His Barons of Rhythm." The first part stuck. It would have seemed incredible in 1936 that 20-odd years later only two big jazz bands were in regular existence — Duke Ellington's and Count Basie's. Basie's influence was greater than Ellington's during the post-war period. Ellington was a source of

inspiration rather than an influence, evolving creatively out of himself. Basie reflects change more because his repertoire has the compositions and arrangements of many different writers.

Proposed merger will be considered at a special meeting of the share holders of The Independent Bank of Sandy to be held at 11:00 a.m. on July 23, 1981 at the offices of the bank at 38561 Proctor Blvd., Sandy, Oregon. The rights of share holders who dissent from the merger are specified in ORS 711.045, which is set forth below. Share holders of record on June 30, 1981 are entitled to vote at the meeting and such share holders will receive, prior to the meeting, a proxy statement providing further information on the proposed merger. This notice is published in compliance with ORS 711.025 (2) and is not a solicitation of proxies.

Excerpts from Oregon Revised Statutes, 711.045 RIGHTS OF STOCK HOLDERS WHO DISSENT TO MERGER:
(1) A dissenting stock holder of a bank shall receive the value in cash of those shares which were voted against a merger upon written demand made to the resulting bank at any time within 30 days after the effective date of the merger, accompanied by the surrender of the stock certificates.

(2) The value of the shares of the dissenting stock holders making written demand under subsection (1) of this section shall be ascertained as of the effective date of the merger, by three appraisers. One appraiser shall be selected by the vote of the owners of 2/3 of the shares involved at a meeting called by the superintendent on 10 days notice, one selected by the Board of Directors of the resulting bank and the third selected by the two so chosen. The valuation agreed upon by any two appraisers shall govern, and all the dissenting stock holders involved shall be bound by the amount so fixed. If any necessary appraiser is not appointed within 60 days after the effective date of the merger or if the appraisal is not completed within 90 days after the merger becomes effective, the superintendent shall cause an appraisal to be made. The expenses of appraisal shall be paid by the resulting bank.

(3) The amount due under the appraisal shall constitute a debt of the resulting bank.
(4) The shares of stock of the resulting bank that would have been delivered to a dissenting stock holder had he not requested payment shall be sold by the resulting bank at an advertised public auction. The resulting bank may purchase the stock if it is the highest bidder and shall resell the shares within six months after the auction,

unless the period is extended by the superintendent at a price, not less than that determined by its Board of Directors. If the shares are sold at public auction at a price greater than the amount paid to the dissenting stock holders, the difference shall be paid to the dissenting stock holders.
