

Shrimp

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1½ tsps. chopped celery
One-eighth tsp. salt
Three-fourths tsp. curry powder
1½ tsps. flour
Three-fourths cup milk
¼ cup cream
Slivered almonds

Rinse shrimp, dry and set aside. Slice pineapple lengthwise through top. Hollow out fruit without cutting through shell. Remove core and cut fruit into bite-size pieces. Return to shell and set aside.

In small saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Add onion and celery and saute until onion is tender, but not brown. Stir in salt and curry powder. Add flour and cook until bubbly. Gradually add milk and cream, stirring constantly until smooth and thickened; cool.

Spoon shrimp onto pineapple halves. Top with curry sauce and garnish with almonds. Makes six servings.

Shrimp Quiche

1 cup tiny Pacific shrimp
1 pre-baked pastry shell, nine-inch
1 cup grated Swiss cheese
½ cup sliced fresh mushrooms
Two-thirds cup cream
2 tsps. dry white wine
3 eggs
½ tsp. salt
One-eighth tsp. pepper
¼ cup sliced green onion

Rinse shrimp with cold water, dry and set aside. Sprinkle cheese evenly in shell and top with mushrooms.

In small, deep bowl, combine remaining ingredients, except shrimp. Blend well using wire whisk; stir in shrimp. Pour over mushrooms.

Bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center of quiche comes out clean.

Shrimp Creole

1½ pounds tiny Pacific shrimp
3 tsps. butter
1 cup coarsely chopped onion
1 cup coarsely chopped green pepper
1 cup coarsely chopped zucchini or celery
2 cloves garlic, finely minced
4 large tomatoes, peeled and chopped
1 can (8 ounce) tomato sauce
½ tsp. black pepper
2 tsps. shredded fresh lemon rind
3 whole cloves
1 bay leaf
½ tsp. dried thyme
½ tsp. honey
3 tsps. finely minced fresh parsley

Rinse shrimp, dry and set aside. Melt butter in large saucepan over medium heat. Add onion, green pepper and zucchini; saute until tender, but not brown. Add garlic and tomatoes; bring to a boil. Reduce heat. Add tomato sauce, pepper, lemon rind, cloves, bay leaf, thyme and honey.

Simmer for 15 to 20 minutes, stirring frequently. Stir in shrimp and heat thoroughly. Serve over hot rice. Garnish with parsley.

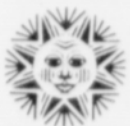
Pacific Shrimp Mousse

2 cups tiny Pacific shrimp
½ can condensed cream of tomato soup (11 ounces)
1 packet (or one tablespoon) unflavored gelatin
½ tsp. salt
3 ounces softened cream cheese
Three-fourths cup mayonnaise
½ cup finely chopped celery
Two to three tablespoons finely minced onion
Two to three dashes garlic powder

Rinse shrimp, dry, chop finely and set aside. Combine soup, unflavored gelatin and salt in small saucepan. Stir constantly over low heat until gelatin is completely dissolved and mixture is smooth. Do not allow mixture to boil. Remove from heat.

In large mixing bowl, cream together cream cheese, mayonnaise, celery, onion and garlic powder. Stir in shrimp. Add tomato soup mixture and blend well. Cover with plastic wrap, preventing air from entering container.

Refrigerate three or four hours or overnight. Roll into ball or log before serving. Serve with crackers.

- Look for cutworm damage in garden.
- Mid-summer plantings of beets, bush beans, carrots, cauliflower, broccoli, lettuce.
- July 10: spray filbert trees for filbert worm.
- July 10-15: spray peach and prune trees for root borers.
- July 17-23: third spray for codling moth in apple and pear trees.
- First planting of Chinese cabbage, kohlrabi, rutabagas on Oregon coast.
- Spray for scale insects on camellias, holly, maple trees.
- Spray for root weevil adults in rhododendrons.
- Check leafy vegetables for caterpillar attack. Control with Dipel or Sevin.
- 12-spotted beetles may be sprayed or dusted with rotenone or Sevin.
- End of month: prune raspberries, boysenberries, other caneberries after harvest.

Weeds annoying, harmful

Weeds are not only an inconvenience to gardeners, they can be a serious threat to vegetable gardens.

Gardeners must wage a constant campaign to eliminate them or weeds can compete with and destroy a number of garden vegetable plants.

Chemical sprays aren't always dependable and the use of herbicides isn't practical on such a small scale. There isn't a single all-purpose herbicide available for use on the many different kinds of weeds that grow in gardens. Even if such a spray existed, it would prob-

bably be as damaging to the vegetables as to the weeds.

In fact, most chemicals that kill weeds are just as damaging to a potential vegetable crop.

The most efficient way to destroy weeds is through the use of a hoe. Shallow cultivation is recommended in the garden, especially when the garden plants are young. Try to cut the weeds off just below ground level with the hoe.

Perennial weeds such as morning glory and quackgrass should be removed every week. A light

scraping action with a hoe works best.

If a rototiller is used to remove weeds, keep the blades as near the surface of the soil as possible to avoid damaging the root systems of the garden crops.

For best results in the garden, clear weeds by cultivating regularly and preferably, by hand.
