## Burglary reported at Paola's Pizza

Sandy police are investigating a burglary reported Monday morning at Paola's Pizza Barn.

According to police reports someone entered the business after it closed Sunday evening and took beer, wine and money.

Last Wednesday, June 24, Sandy police arrested Fred D. Hall of Gresham on warrants issued in Multnomah County for failure to appear on a driving under the in-

fluence of intoxicants charge, failure to appear on a hit and run charge and failure to appear on a second-degree theft charge.

A Sandy woman was cited last Thursday evening following an accident near the intersection of Meinig Avenue and Highway 211. Socowro Pola Cinni, 36, was charged with hit and run, no operator's license and failure to show proof of liability insurance.

Last Thursday, police took Gary D. Cribbins, 39, of Boring into custody after Nancy Faye Hoffman, 37 of Sandy

filed an assault complaint against him. Cribbins was taken to Clackamas County Jail.

Sandy police arrested Allan Eugene Schmidt of Sandy last Thursday on warrants issued by Multnomah County officials. He was charged with failure to appear on driving under the influence of intoxicants, driving with a suspended license, driving with a revoked license and misuse of an Oregon driver's license.

William J. Willis, 19, of Sandy was arrested last Thursday on warrants

issued by Multnomah County officials and charged with a parole violation on a second-degree burglary.

A criminal mischief to a home under construction was reported Friday. According to police reports, someone entered the home on Orr Circle and broke the bathroom mirror and four light bulbs. Damage was estimated at \$105.

Saturday, a Sandy man reported that someone had taken two 4x4 front hubs from his residence on Beers Avenue. They are valued at \$100.

closed July 11 and will reopen July 18.

## Victim drowns despite lifesaving attempts

A 15-year-old Vancouver, Wash., boy drowned last Saturday after he, another boy, a Sandy woman and a Gresham man were pulled into Tillamook Bay by the undertow.

The search for Paul Neumann, who had celebrated his 15th birthday Friday, was "discontinued pending further developments," according to a Coast Guard spokesman in Tillamook.

A Coast Guard vessel rescued Michael Holt, 13, of Vancouver, Nancy Perkins, 21, of Sandy, and Mohn

Dezellen, 21, of Gresham. They were treated for hypothermia at Tillamook County General Hospital and released.

The two boys, who were part of a Boy Scout camp, were wading on the beach at about 12:15 p.m. when they were caught in the undertow, according to a spokesman for the Tillamook County sheriff's department.

Perkins and Dezellen, who were on the beach at the time, swam out into the bay to save the boys and also became caught in the undertow.
