Jim Lehrer returns in 'Chronicle'

"U.S. Chronicle" is back for its second year. The weekly, award-winning documentary series, with Jim Lehrer as host, returns to public television July 5 with 20 new reports, each one offering viewers a close-up, behind-the-headlines look at national issues and trends. (Local times may vary; check listings.)

Award-winning broadcast journalist and correspondent Jim Lehrer will remain with the show as the unifying link in every episode of "U.S. Chronicle," introducing and summarizing each half-hour report.

"I am delighted that "U.S. Chronicle" is returning for a second season," says Lehrer. "And I'm delighted to again be a part of it. I think we proved last year that the experiment had merit. This year I think we're proving that the quality can be sustained."

"U.S. Chronicle" is the first public affairs series produced by a consortium of public television stations. It received the Gold Medal Award for the best documentary series at the 23rd annual International Film & TV Festival of New York last November.

Each "U.S. Chronicle" program deals with a single topic of national importance, and focuses on what's happening now to people and places, trends and issues. The ques-

tions raised are often pointed and controversial, and are examined by the reactions, opinions and experiences of Americans.

What's in store for viewers of "U.S. Chronicle"? The premier program in the second series, "Abscam and the Philadelphia Story," produced by WHYI, Philadelphia, reports on that city's history of political corruption (in the last decade, according to the program, more than 100 of the city's public officials have been convicted) and its role in the Abscam scandal.

"Lower Lancaster Street," the second program, produced by WMHT, Schenectady, reports on "gentrification" — a word coined many years ago by London's poor working class, who were evicted from their homes by high-income people they called the landed gentry — and its effects on one city block in Albany, N.Y.

"Gentrification," says Lehrer, "is a fancy word with a history and meaning that are anything but fancy... everywhere it happens there are conflicts and pain." The third and fourth programs in the series are "Boomtown," produced by KRMA, Denver, a report on the modern-day energy boomtown of Craig, Colo., and the problems prosperity is bringing to that community; and "A Different Kind of Life," produced by WETA, Washington, profiles of three women with cancer who continue to lead active lives. Topics for the next month include a report on gulf fisheries; a police dog abuse case; a report on the re-investigation of private schools in Los Angeles; and a profile of a coal operator coping with environmental regulations. In the following weeks "U.S. Chronicle" will report on gaming in New Jersey; upward/downward mobility; rural crime; human potential groups; a wry look at Minnesotans; paving over farmland; the best high-school basketball player in the county; nuclear disposal; the Aspen Music Festival; and a modern-day immigration
