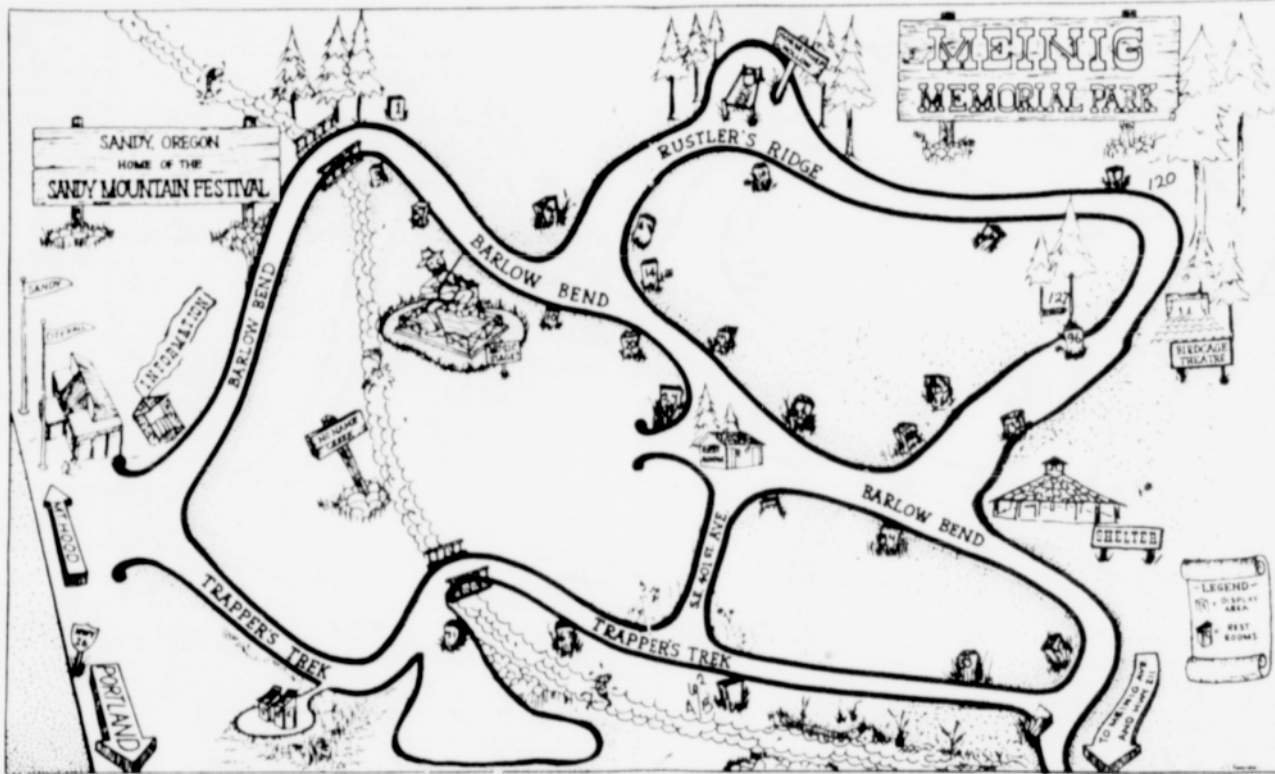
Included will be all types of food, jewelry and metal sculpture, woodcarving, macrame and drink.
