'81 program dedicated to Mt. Hood Mudders

The program for the 1981 Sandy Mountain Festival recognizes an organization whose good works go beyond ardent support of the annual festival.

The Sandy Mountain Festival Committee this year dedicated the 1981 Festival Program to the Mount Hood Mudders Four-Wheel Drive Club.

The club was formed in 1975 and since that time, its more than 30 members have been active in full support of the festival, providing the dam at No Name Creek and electricity to the front and back stage.

Other Mudder projects include delivery of Kiwanis Christmas baskets, cutting firewood for the elderly and work at the Mount Hood Crippled Childrens Camp.

The club also stages four-wheel drive races and donates the proceeds to charity.

"He was tough, but fun to work with," Bruns remembered about his late boss and friend.

Bruns' association with Disney was longstanding and proved extremely beneficial to both men.

Bruns is probably best known for composing the score and song to "Davy Crockett" — which sold more than 8 million records.

One day Disney came into the studio and asked Bruns to "make up a little something" to serve as a theme song for the motion picture which later turned into a television series. Neither dreamed it would be such a hit.

Other productions Bruns worked with included the "Farewell Song" which sold

more than 1 million records and the "Zorro" theme.

Disney Studios sold \$1 million in albums with Bruns' music from the movie "Jungle Book."

He also worked on the "Sleeping Beauty" soundtrack which received an Academy Award nomination for best score. Other works which received Academy Award nominations included "Sword in the Stone" and "Babes in Toyland."

The movies "Herbie Rides Again," "Robin Hood," "Aristocats," "Jungle Book" and "Love Bug" all made the top 10 in Academy Award nominations. Each also grossed more than \$25 million, Bruns said.

Other movie soundtracks

Bruns worked with include "The Absent-Minded Professor," "Son of Flubber," "101 Dalmations" and "Johnny Tremain."

Kids and adults who have visited either Disneyland in California or Disney World in Florida have heard some of Bruns music. His Disney amusement park shows include "Bear Band Serenade," "The Enchanted Tiki Room" and "Pirates of the Caribbean."

Bruns wrote many of the scores for the Disney Sunday television show, "Wonderful World of Disney," and the "Mickey Mouse Club" Show.

All told, Bruns has done more than 200 motion picture, television show, cartoon and documentaries. He has also done more than 100 commercials.
