Sandy Blues explode for four wins

The Sandy Blues went on an offensive rampage last week, battering four opponents for four consecutive wins in girls softball action.

The Blues opened with a 19-0 win over Rockwood A, as the Sandy team unleashed a string of singles to bury Rockwood.

Melissa O'Malley's double was the big blow for the Blues. Sandy then rolled up a 34-0 score against an outclassed Lynch team. Tami Tunjum, Jackie Kunkel, Stephanie Loftgren and Laura Williamson slugged three base hits apiece for Sandy while Donna Gray blasted a home run. Sandy also bombed Welches by a 29-1 score as Candi Rudisill and Williamson hit home runs.

The final Blues victory came against the Sandy Whites by a 16-6 score. Rudisill hit another homer as well as a triple and teammates Debbie Evans and Kim Roberts chipped in with a double and triple to lead the Blues.

Rudisill also pitched well, averaging 10 strikeouts a game for the year. Sandy outscored its opponents 98-7 in the four games. The Blues record is now 7-0.

In Pigtail softball action, the Sandy Sluggers upped their record to 10-1 with two big wins this week.

The Sluggers downed Welches 11-7 Sunday behind the home run hitting of Tracy Brinser and Charlene Kasch. The teams had been tied atop the league with just one loss apiece going into the game and the Sluggers secured the league lead with the win. Shannon Baker got the win on the mound.

The Sluggers then downed Orient 11-2 Monday to continue their hot streak. Baker slugged a three-run homer in the third to break open a tight game and Sandy got two homers in the fourth to ice the win. Brinser and Tiffany Griffin hit the round-trippers.

In boys baseball, Bruce Cook Ins. picked up three wins against a single loss this week to move into strong contention in the Junior Federal League.

Sandy opened with a 5-2 win over league-leading Glenfair, as pitcher Matt Novotny yielded just two hits and struck out a dozen batters for Sandy. The Bruce Cook team then exploded for 13 runs in the first inning and

went on to beat Rockwood 26-3. Randy Gifford got the win.

But Lynch put a halt to the Sandy streak, claiming a 12-5 win Saturday afternoon. Lynch came up with eight runs in the third inning with some timely hitting and a lapse in the Sandy defense to claim the win, snapping a five-game Bruce Cook winning streak.

But Sandy got back on track Monday evening with a 9-5 win over Glenfair. The teams were tied for second place in the Federal League with 6-3 records going into the game. Randy Wheeler drove in the go-ahead runs in the third with a triple for Sandy. Darren Pullen and Tony Hale paved the way with two hits apiece.

Coast to Coast dropped a game to Sweetbriar, but came back to claim a pair of victories in Midget Federal play. Sweetbriar won 7-2 on

the strength of a number of base on balls issued by Sandy pitchers.

But Coast to Coast came back to dump the same Sweetbriar team 13-11 Wednesday, playing error-free ball and hitting with abandon. Donavon Buhl hit a triple in the second and Ty Beckley and Doug Stevenson hit back-to-back triples in the third to pace the Sandy attack. Beckley later singled home Steve Haines for what proved to be the winning run.

Coast to Coast then mowed down Rockwood 14-7 to up its record to 4-6. Gary Copher started things off with a first inning double and Sandy was never headed.

Orient I scored a 7-3 win over Sandy in Midget American League play. San-

dy fell behind early, but Lance Conger came in to put out the fire and keep Sandy in the game. Conger also took to the mound with a good relief job Friday as Sandy nipped Corbett 7-6. The win raised Sandy's record to 6-2.

Sandy II raised its record to 8-2 in Midget National League play with a pair of victories this week.

Sandy dumped Rockwood II 17-12 as Jacob Iverson came on in relief to secure the win. Doug Hodge, Kent Taylor and Aaron Knotts led the Sandy batting attack and Knotts turned in a strong defensive performance.

Sandy also gained a win by forfeit when Lynch II failed to field enough players.

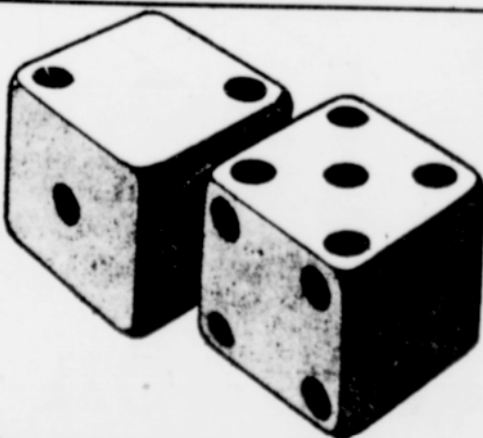
