

## Mike's Place reports theft of beer, money

Sandy police are investigating a burglary reported last Tuesday, June 30, at Mike's Place.

Personnel at the tavern, formerly Ron's No Place, told police that someone entered the tavern after closing Monday and took four kegs of Schlitz Malt Liqueur, valued at \$200; five cases of assorted beer, valued at \$80; a microwave oven, valued at \$250, and approximately \$1,000 in cash.

Sandy police are also investigating three incidents of first-degree theft by deception. Someone cashed three checks written on a closed account at the Independent Bank of Sandy. The incidents were reported June 30.

A Sandy resident who lives on Highway 26 told police June 30 that his home was burglarized and \$250 in currency and a man's ring were taken.

Police arrested a 15-year-old Sandy youth June 30 after Sandy Rexall reported a shoplifting. The youth was charged with second-degree theft for taking a pair of sunglasses according to police reports.

Thursday, July 2, a first-degree theft was reported at Sandy Lumber Co. According to police reports, \$288 worth of hardware supplies were taken.

Sunday, police arrested Roger Lee Green, 32, of Sandy on fugitive warrants issued by Clackamas County authorities. He was charged with failure to appear on a possession of a controlled substance charge.

## Porcelain show set at library

Porcelain was first made in its primitive form in China during the T'ang dynasty from 618 to 907 A.D.

The art of painting porcelain was popularized in the 1800s and moved to the United States from Europe. During World War I the art dipped in popularity. But now, 60 years later, it is making a comeback and Sandy area residents have the opportunity to study the work of area painters at the Sandy Public Library.

Honoring the art, Gov. Vic

Atiyeh proclaimed July as "Porcelain Art Month."

To help celebrate the occasion, the library is exhibiting the works of four area artists and pieces from the collections of others.

Maxine Taylor of Cheryville arranged the exhibit. She is a former teacher of the art and a member of the International Porcelain Art Teachers, Inc. She has painted porcelain for nearly 10 years and outlined the process of putting the colors to the hard porcelain.

The finest hard porcelain,

she said, is manufactured in Japan, Germany and France. Most of the paints used are mineral paints.

The paints are applied to the porcelain and fired in a kiln to 1323 degrees which sinks the paint into the glaze.

If desired, gold is then put on the piece. That is, in turn fired to 1112 degrees in the kiln. Unlike the paint, however, the gold sets on top of the glaze and doesn't sink.

That means as pieces with gold grow older and are handled for a period of time,

the gold coloring may begin to wear.

Along with the work of Mrs. Taylor, pieces painted by Alice Shockey of Cheryville, Josephine Schaffer of Sandy and Wanda Lake of Boring are on display.

Pieces from the collection of Margaret Crownover of Sandy and the Collector's Cottage in Sandy are also on display.

The exhibit will remain on display throughout the month of July.

A Sandy man died last Thursday after the motorcycle he was driving collided head-on with a car on the Scenic Columbia River Highway south of Troutdale.

Jeffrey L. Provolt, 23, was killed when the motorcycle he was driving crossed the center line and struck an oncoming car on Highway 30 near the Stark Street bridge crossing the Sandy River, according to Multnomah County sheriff's department investigators.

The southbound car he collided with was driven by Monique Garland, 18, of Portland. Garland and her passenger, Charles Holcomb, 18, of Portland suffered minor bruises in the accident.

No traffic violations were found and no citations were issued.
