Hollywood stars take a chance

The lure of the greasepaint
and dreams of rousing
applause annually lure dozens
of Hollywood's movie and
television personalities to live
theater. Why?

Are they risking their estab-
lished reputations? For most,
no. They were trained in the
theater, got their starts there
and don't want their well-
developed vocal projection to
diminish. Two who did gam-
ble big, however, and came
out winners, are Rock Hudson
and Elizabeth Taylor whose
careers both developed entire-
ly on-camera.

It was Carol Burnett who
persuaded Rock Hudson to co-
star with her six or so years
ago in a West Coast stage
show that ran for six weeks.
Since then, he has become a
major box office draw around
the country as the star of such
demanding acting-singing
roles as King Arthur in
'Camelot.' (Now that he's
proven he can do it, however,
Hudson returns to television
this fall starring as a sleuth
for NBC).

The betting was against
Elizabeth Taylor making good
on stage when she headed for
Broadway as the manipula-
tive Regina in a revival of Lil-
lian Hellman's 'The Little
Foxes.' But as viewers of the
recent Tony Awards' telecast

discovered, the lady who has
been called the last of the
great movie stars was nomi-
nated, in her first Broadway
play ever, as one the five best
dramatic actresses of the
year.

Because of their superstar
brackets, though, it's suspec-
ted that their stage triumphs
cost both Hudson and Taylor
some income.

That's not always the case,
however, as Ricardo Montal-
ban told us. Until he became
the star of 'Fantasy Island,'
Montalban found that getting
guest-star billing on television
specials three or four times a
year just wasn't enough to
keep up his stately home and
pay for his children's school-
ing.

'Only in a series do you
have real security,' he says.
'Producers, fearing over-
exposure, just won't use a
guest star more than several
times a year. Though such
roles kept my name before
the public, the real godsend
for me was doing regional
theater.'

Another category of Holly-
wood folks who head for the
stage are stage-trained actors
who are safely locked into
series (which they may love
doing) but welcome the break
to prove to themselves, as
well as the world, that they
have range.

If and when their series

end, it's some insurance
against being trapped by type-
casting.

Take Pam Dawber, for
instance, the Mindy of 'Mork
& Mindy.' She's spending her
vacation from the ABC series
showing off her strong, well-
trained soprano voice as the
star of the West Coast produc-
tion of 'The Pirates of Pen-
zance.'

Jamie Farr says that as far
as he's concerned he wishes
