Community center, church closed for meet

Sandy Seventh-day Adventist Church and Community Services Center will be closed during the week of July 10-18 while the church members attend the annual conference-wide camp meeting at Gladstone.

Pastor Terry Zull joined other ministers of the Adventist churches of western Oregon and southwest Washington on the campground for the past week to prepare the facilities for some 18,000 expected attendees and campers.

Campers will attend a full schedule of daily religious services, as well as select from a slate of classes designed to strengthen the Christian life and home. All services are open to the public, Zull said.

The 25,000-member Oregon Conference is headed by Edwin C. Beck, president. A high percentage of these members attend the camp meeting over the course of the week and are joined by hundreds of other Seventh-day Adventists from other western states, Beck said.

Since the days of the buckboard, for 103 years, western Oregon and southwestern Washington Adventists have met each summer for their annual spiritual retreat.

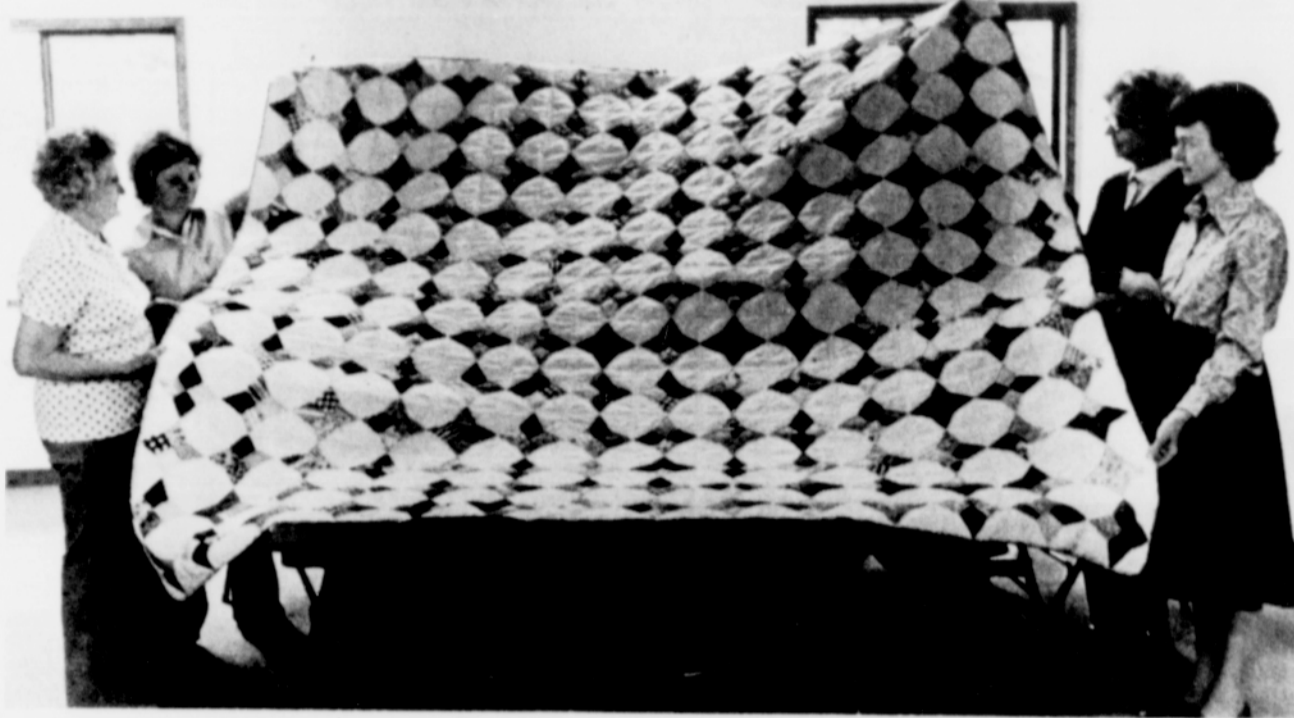
This year's convocation, however, is in considerable contrast with the old-time tent meeting.

While the format is basically the same, instead

of hearing back-to-back religious preaching all day long, campers are offered adult education classes.

The usually quiet 79-acre grounds at the outskirts of Gladstone are transformed almost overnight into a bustling city with a resident population of more than 8,000.

Mobile unit slates Sandy health tests

The Mobile Health Unit, sponsored by the Oregon Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, will be in town during the Sandy Mountain Festival.

The traveling van will be at the parking lot of Williams Thriftway this Sunday, July 12, to provide medical screening.

Tests for lung functions, blood pressure will be available, along with a computerized health analysis. Those who are found needing medical attention will be referred to their family physician.

The mobile unit will be at the parking lot from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. The public, 12 years of age and above, is invited to participate in these free screenings.

Change in law benefits many self-employed

Certain retired self-employed people — mainly insurance agents and farmers — will benefit from a recent change in the law.

The change concerns the definition of income which counts for the annual earnings test, the measure used to decide if a person is retired.

Under the old law, all of the income a self-employed person received in a year counted under the annual earnings test, even if part of it was actually earned before that year.

Under the new law, income received in a year after the year a self-employed person becomes entitled to Social Security retirement benefits if it is not earned after the month of entitlement will not affect benefit payments.

Since this provision is effective for taxable years ending after December 1977, some self-employed people will be due benefits that were withheld for 1978, 1979 or 1980.

The Social Security office cannot identify the people affected by this change in the law. Therefore anyone who thinks he or she may be affected should get in touch with the Portland Social Security office, 12630 S.E. Division, Portland, OR 97236.

The person should bring his or her self-employment tax returns for 1978, 1979 or 1980 and any other information available.
